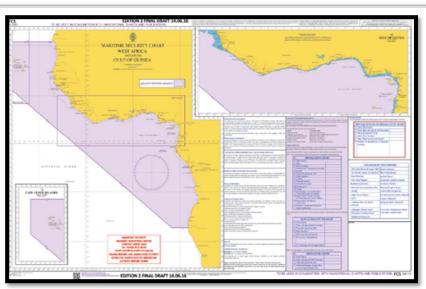


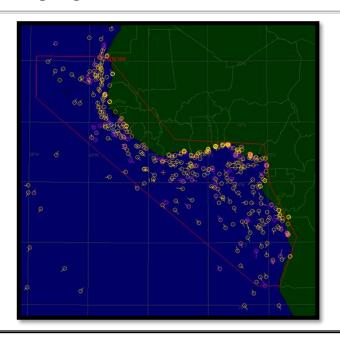


Maritime Domain Awareness for Trade-GoG

- Providing 24/7 monitoring and support for all of industry

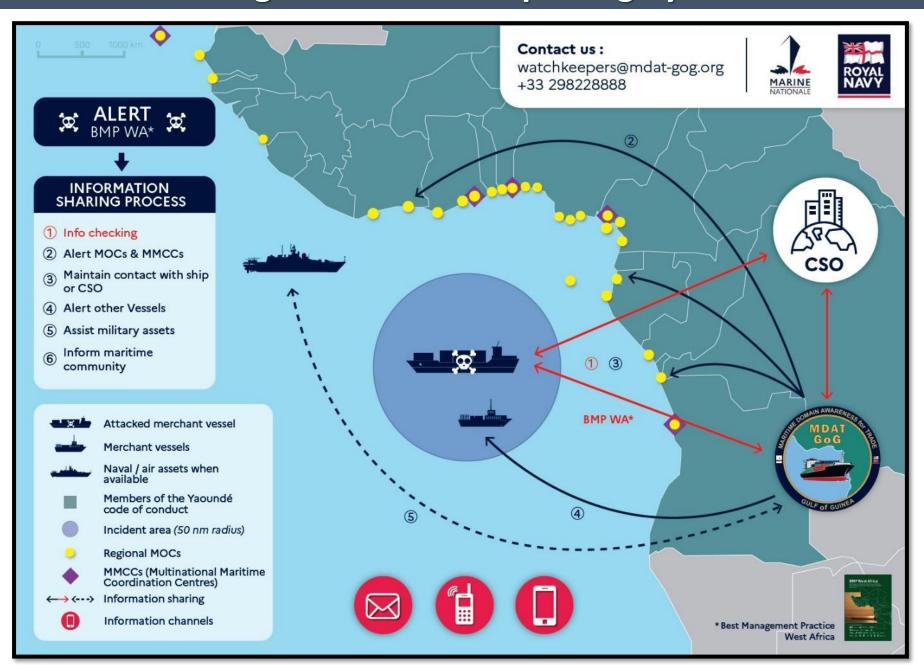

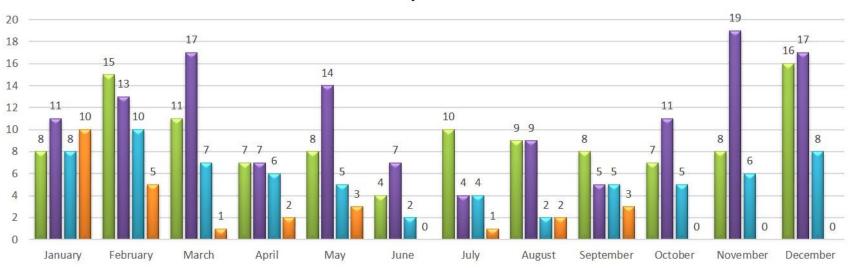


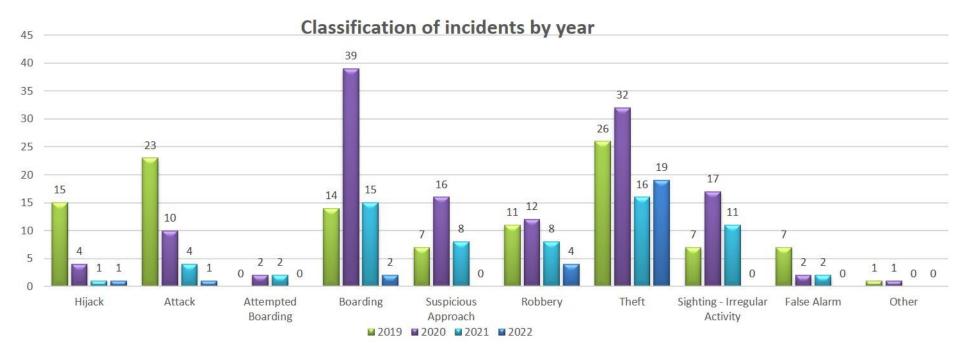






Total Incidents reported to MDAT-GoG

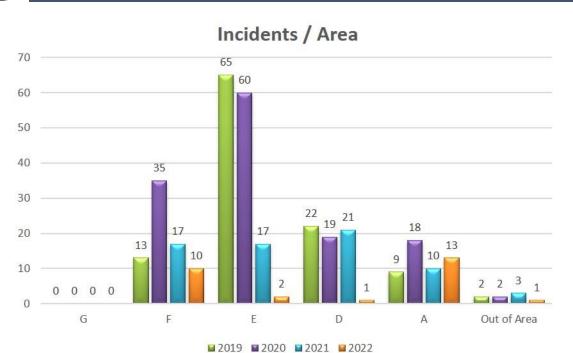


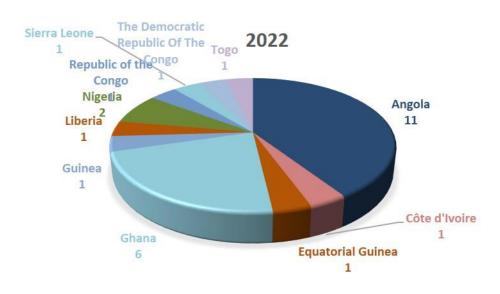


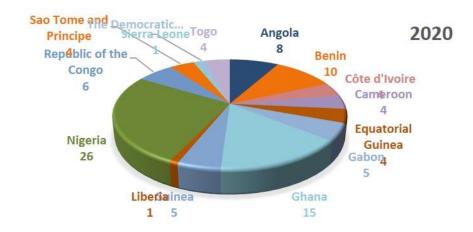


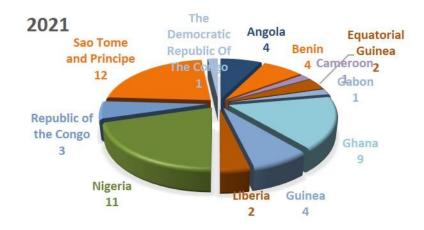










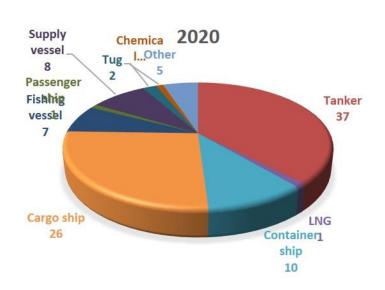


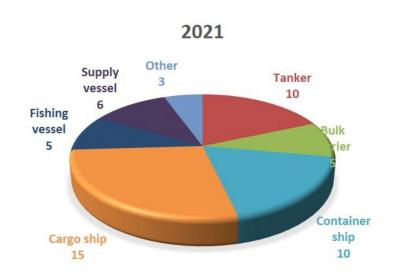


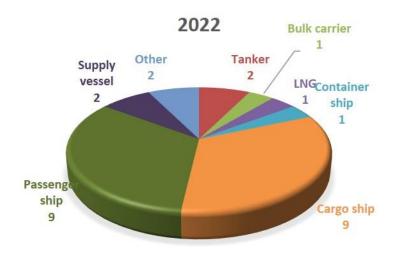




Class of ships impacted by incidents



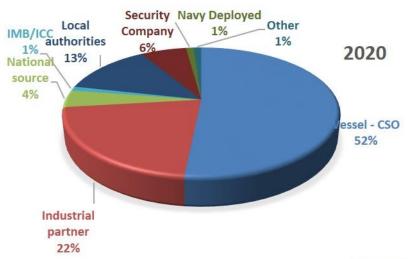


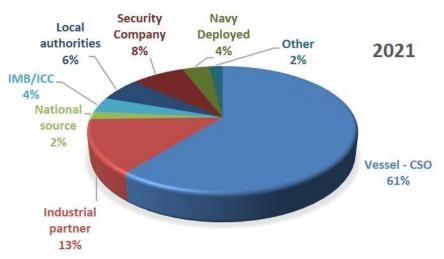


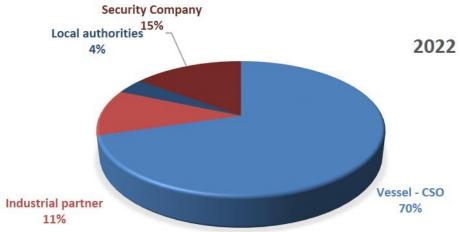










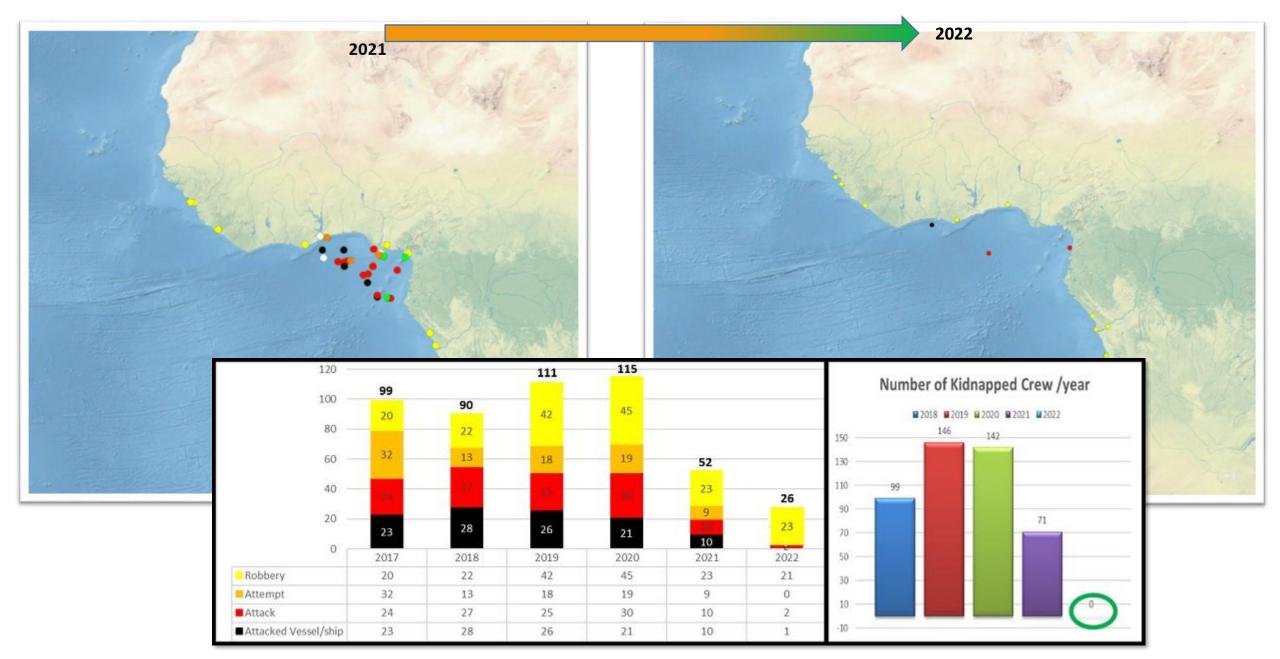

Some case study examples





SUCCESS Story:

- **Ship and shipowner**: BMP compliance (report MDAT GoG, citadel, report via CSO ...)
- MDAT-GoG alerted IMB, C4I, local MOCs and NAVAREA coordinator
- Patrol vessel of a partner navy sails toward the incident (too far to act)
- **2 local navies** in alert
- MDAT-GoG advised CSO to re-route the ship towards the local navies TTW
- Successive interventions of **both navies**
- Crew safe and sound ship deterioration

False alarms:

- **Ship and shipowner** reported possible boarding attempt
- MDAT-GoG checks the information but raises doubts about the nature of the incident / does not publish
- **Partner centre** forecasts the alert
- > 12h later MDAT-GoG receives confirmation of misinterpretation of the situation
- The piracy alert did not allow the authorities to conduct the operation as they wished



- importance of communication between organizations
- need for mutual knowledge and trust
- necessity to share post-incident analysis



Better understanding and more training are keys to improvement...

















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
