






### Theft, Robbery, And Piracy at Sea (TRAPS)

Number of TRAPS incidents in 2023: 68





- Incidents continue to be petty theft and non-violent in nature
- 2 incidents involved death and serious injuries One fisherman died from a sea robbery incident in Bangladesh, while six others sustained serious injuries from an incident in India





### Theft, Robbery And Piracy at Sea (TRAPS)

#### Key Areas of Concern for Boarding/Attempted Boarding incidents:



#### Singapore Strait: 37

- More incidents recorded in 2023 than 2022 (27) and 2021 (20)
- Bulk Carriers, Tugs & Barges, and Tankers were the most frequent targets

#### Belawan Anchorage Area: 7

- More incidents recorded in 2023 than whole of 2022 (5)
- Mainly occurred during the period of darkness
- Vessels involved were Bulk Carriers and Tankers

#### Manila Anchorage Area: 4

- 3):
  - Mainly occurred onboard anchored vessels
  - Vessels involved were Bulk Carriers and Tankers



Theft, Robbery And Piracy at Sea (TRAPS)

#### Modus Operandi: Generally similar to previous years

#### Singapore Strait:

- Perpetrators observed to conduct opportunistic boardings on slow moving vessels (speeds of 7 to 12 knots) with low to medium freeboard of less than 8m
- Most incidents continue to be petty theft and non-confrontational
- Observed a continuing trend in incidents in Phillip Channel since end of 2022, with 20 incidents in the first half of 2023



Picture of a typical wooden boat used by perpetrators in Singapore Strait

#### **Belawan and Manila Anchorage Areas:**

- Activities usually conducted in small boats carrying 2-4 pax, with perpetrators avoiding confrontation
- Stolen items include ship stores and paint
- Incidents mostly involved anchored vessels during period of darkness


0 incident in 2022

- Last incident recorded in 2021.
- The Trilateral Cooperation Arrangement between Indonesia, Malaysia and Philippines is likely to have an effect on the incident numbers; conducting joint patrols in their respective areas in Sulu-Celebes Sea.
- While <u>NO</u> MT incidents was reported in 2023, all countries and the maritime community should remain vigilant.


Number of MI incidents in 2023: 522






- Fishing vessels account for majority of incidents, and dead/missing individuals
- Number of incidents involving passenger vessels in 2023 doubled over same period in 2022

#### **Types of Vessels:**




#### Top 3 Vessel Types with Number of Dead/Missing and Rescued:





- Similar to past trends, majority of incidents involved sunk/capsized and adrift, and main causes of incidents are bad weather and equipment failure
- The IFC expects the number of MI in the second half of 2023 to increase due to the South West monsoon season between July and September






### Illegal, Unregulated, and Unreported Fishing (IUUF)


Number of IUUF incidents in 2023: 308





 Increase in number of incidents can be attributed to reopening of fishing industry after COVID-19

Top 3 nationalities of vesselsTop 3 local incidents ininvolved with poaching:waters off:





• One international IUUF incident involved a Korean fish carrier, which violated the regional Western and Central Pacific Fisheries Commission (WCPFC) regulations.



 In the second half of 2023, IFC expects IUUF incidents to increase. However, the rate of increase will be slower due to stepped up enforcement efforts from regional authorities



Number of CS incidents in 2023: 413







- The IFC observed a consistent increase in CS incidents since 2021
- Domestic Products and Drug smuggling incidents contributed to the majority of CS incidents

# Contraband Smuggling (CS)

### Key areas of concern:

#### South East Asia

 Most common contraband goods smuggled: Domestic Products, Drugs (mainly methamphetamine), and Fuel


#### South Asia

 Drug smuggling in India, Sri Lanka, and Bangladesh driven by the flow of (1) Heroin from Afghanistan smuggled by boat from the Persian Gulf, and (2) Cannabis and Meth (including Yaba) from both Afghanistan and the Golden Triangle.

# Irregular Human Migration (IHM)

#### Number of IHM incidents in 2023: 123

- 29% vs 2022
- 174 incidents recorded in 2022



- 1,645 migrants were deemed to have moved across maritime borders illegally, primarily through Human Smuggling
- Decrease may be due to the stabilization of the political and economic situation in Sri Lanka

### Irregular Human Migration (IHM)

### Top departure locations (based on number of migrants):

#### Bangladesh / Myanmar

- · Accounts for largest flow of migrants
- Small number of incidents, but large number of migrants per vessel
- Malaysia and Indonesia are preferred destination

#### Indonesia


- Indonesia accounts for 39 incidents reported in 2023
- Most incidents involved small groups of migrants
- Malaysia remains preferred destination

#### Main IHM Routes





### Environmental Security (ENVSEC)



- Increase in incidents was due to increased maritime activities in the region, with MARPOL the main ENVSEC concern.
- All MIE incidents recorded involved sand mining, and this could be due to the growing construction industry.
- In the second half of 2023, IFC expects ENVSEC incidents to remain high due to resumption in global economic activities

#### Number of CYBSEC incidents in 2023: 9

+6 vs 2022 (ALL)


Incidents recorded in ALL of 2022: 3

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- Most of the incidents involved damage to underwater cables, impacting the internet connectivity on land, especially in Taiwan and the Solomon Islands.
- While open source reporting of CYBSEC incidents remain limited, the IFC has reviewed our internal processes to include a wider scope of incidents.

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
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
