

MARITIME AWARENESS WEEK (21 - 25 AUGUST 2023)

Within the Singapore Strait (SS):

- 1. The modus operandi for the perpetrators remains consistent with that of petty crime: (a) <u>avoided confrontation</u>, and (b) <u>fled immediately upon being sighted</u> by ship crew.
- 2. Bulk carriers, tankers and tugs & barges are the most frequently targeted vessels.
- 3. Shipboard protection measures are effective to deter sea robbery incidents.

To reinforce the best MARSEC practices to deter sea robbery, ships heading to Singapore Strait while transiting Malacca Strait during the campaign week are encouraged to follow "IFC":


- **Implement** shipboard protection measures **before** entering Phillip Channel (103° 30'E)
- **Forward** photos of your shipboard protection measures to IFC via email
- 3 Call the IFC to receive real time MARSEC and leaves time MARSEC updates




Examples of Shipboard Protection Measures



Maintain all-round lookout at elevated position



Turn on deck lightings for greater situational awareness.



Sound ship's alarm when suspicious small craft(s) sighted.
