
### **NUMBER OF INCIDENTS**





### **KEY EVENTS & OBSERVATIONS**:

- During this month eight incident were recorded (higher compared to the 4 incidents in July 2017 and lower to the 12 in July 2016).
- Seven incidents transpired while the attacked vessels were at anchor and one while underway where 62.5% transpired during the POD. Of note that since January 2018, perpetrators are prevalently targeting Bulk Carriers followed by Tugs and Barges.
- In this period, a total of two incidents were recorded in the Singapore Strait and approaches. In said area 16 incidents have been recorded since January 2018 (5 unsuccessful actions), 42 since 2017, and 60 since 2016; most of them with same characteristics, namely: incidents transpired during the POD, while anchored, perpetrators escaped when spotted or when alarm raised by crew, little to no violence (Of note is that only on 2015 there were recorder 115 incidents).








### **KEY EVENTS & OBSERVATIONS**:

- In this period, a total of two Sea Theft incidents were recorded in Batangas anchorage. Previous incident recorded in that area occurred on 25/09/17 (Attempted Sea Theft). In 2017, seven incidents were recorded in that area, one in 2016 and four in 2015.
- A total of one incident was recorded in the Samarinda Anchorage. In said area 12 incidents (most of them not reported to local authorities) have been recorded since January 2018 (6 Sea Theft and 6 attempted actions), 17 since 2017, 22 since 2016, and 25 since 2015; all of them with same characteristics, namely: incidents transpired during the POD, while anchored, perpetrators escaped when spotted or when alarm raised by crew, little to no violence.
- A total of 2 incident were recorded in the Chittagong Anchorage. In said area 9 incidents have been recorded since January 2018 (4 Sea Robbery, 1 Sea Theft and 4 attempted actions), 17 since 2017, 24 since 2016, and 38 since 2015 (10 Sea Theft, 13 Sea Robbery, 6 Piracy/Kidnap/Hijack and 9 Attempted Actions). Of note is that in the Sea Theft incident on 19/07, after reporting to local authorities, Bangladesh Coast Guard dispatched a patrol to the area which was able to identify the perpetrators' boat detain them and recover the stolen mooring ropes, which were later returned to the vessel attacked.
- Since January 2018, 11 incidents have been either foiled or the perpetrators detained and the stolen items recovered by local authorities (4 in Bangladesh, 1 in India, 3 in Indonesia, 1 in Philippines and 2 in Malaysia).








### **KEY EVENTS**:

- This month saw the highest number of MI incidents in the year so far, with the spike in death toll may be attributed to adverse
  weather conditions
- On 03 July, a passenger boat sunk-capsized due to bad weather condition off Selayar Island, Indonesia which caused the death of 35 passengers (Typhoons Prapiroon and Maria)
- On 05 July, a tourist boat sunk-capsized due to bad weather condition off Phuket, Thailand which caused the death of 47 tourists (Typhoons Prapiroon and Maria)
- On 21 July, 14 fishing vessels sunk-capsized due to bad weather condition off Barguna, Bangladesh which caused 92 missing fishermen (Tropical storms Ampil, Jongdari and Son-Tinh)

### Contraband Trafficking - July Executive Summary








### Notes:

- There were two weapon smuggling cases involving seizures of small arms made in the Phillipines within several days of each other (14 Jun 46 x .45 Automatic Pistols; 19 Jun 10x .38 Revolvers and 4x .45 Pistols). Both were at Cebu and involved the weapons being moved via ferry. The first seizure was bound for Mindanao and the second for Leyte. That brings the *tally of weapon smuggling cases to Five in 2018 which is very small* as compared to other categories.
- There was a **spike in wildlife smuggling seizures** relating to Sea Cucumbers in the month of July as compared to the previous 6 months (Four in India and one in China).
- The largest drugs seizure was approx. 35 kg of Cocaine intercepted in Vietnam that had been shipped via container. The drugs were sent in one of 17 containers containing scrap steel. Vietnam's Ba Ria-Vung Tau police said that this is the Cocaine haul was the largest ever drug haul in the province.

# RECOMMENDATIONS

#### IFC Advises:

- 1. All mariners to report any incidents in a timely manner to the nearest coastal state and the IFC at the earliest possible time.
- 2. Ships moving at slow speeds or choosing to remain at anchor in areas where sea robbery/theft is regularly reported should remain vigilant and adopt necessary and/or added security measures.
- 3. All mariners to take note of a description of the perpetrators and to take photos of the perpetrators if possible. Where available, CCTV footage capturing the incident should be provided to the coastal state authorities for follow-on investigation.
- 4. Shippers and Seafarers operating in Sulu Sea and in vicinity of East Sabah Waters are strongly recommended to be vigilant and to establish contact with both Malaysian and Philippines Authorities to report their presence. Please refer to IFC Spot Commentary 1/18 for the latest assessment of the situation in that affected area.
- 5. Shippers are advised to take note that the threat of terrorist activity in the maritime domain remains a possibility in the region due to ISIS and the Al-Qaeda. The possibility of this threat was previously quoted in Al-Qaeda's online magazine "Resurgence", which called for the disruption of global trade and shipping through acts of piracy, among other tactics. Shippers are therefore advised to exercise vigilance and to adopt self-defensive measures as stated in the Regional Guide to Counter Piracy and Armed Robbery Against Ships in Asia, especially when transiting narrow choke points and areas which are known to have experienced incidents of sea robbery/piracy.

Note: Information herein has been derived from various internal and external sources such as Focal Points, OPCENs and other maritime stakeholders. Seafarers should remain vigilant especially in areas where the threat level is assessed to be of concern in accordance with the IFC's assessments via its Weekly Report or Spot Commentaries. Ships should apply the appropriate security measures (such as the Tugs and Barge Guide, Guide for Tankers Operating in Asia and the Regional Guide to Counter Piracy and Armed Robbery Against Ships in Asia). Ship masters should also be aware of and refer to the Maritime Security Charts Q6112 and Q6113, both published by the UK Hydrographic Office.

The IFC seeks your observations in the course of your normal business. The IFC would like to remind mariners to be mindful of national and international laws, company and other policy requirements and also health and safety obligations, whilst recording these observations. The reporting of such events to IFC does not absolve you of your obligations towards coastal/port/flag authorities.
