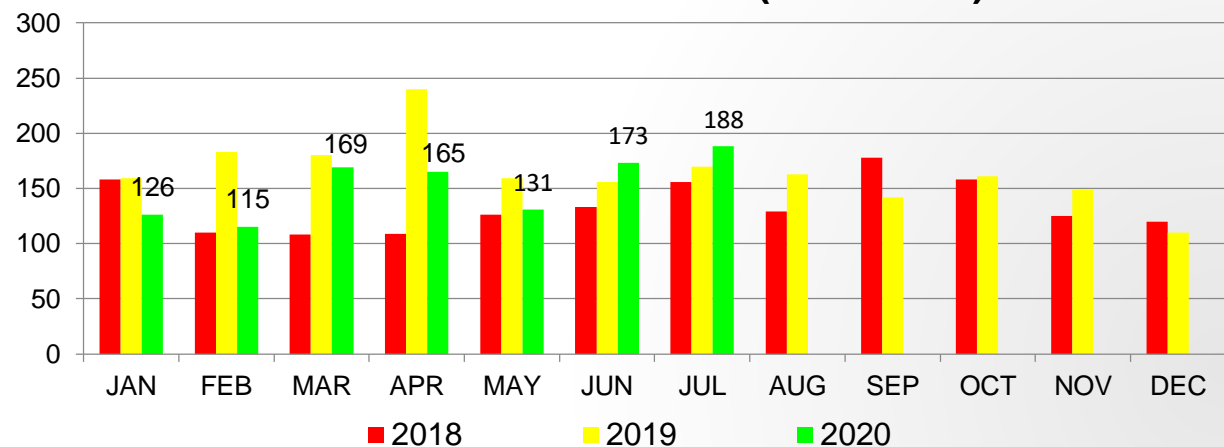

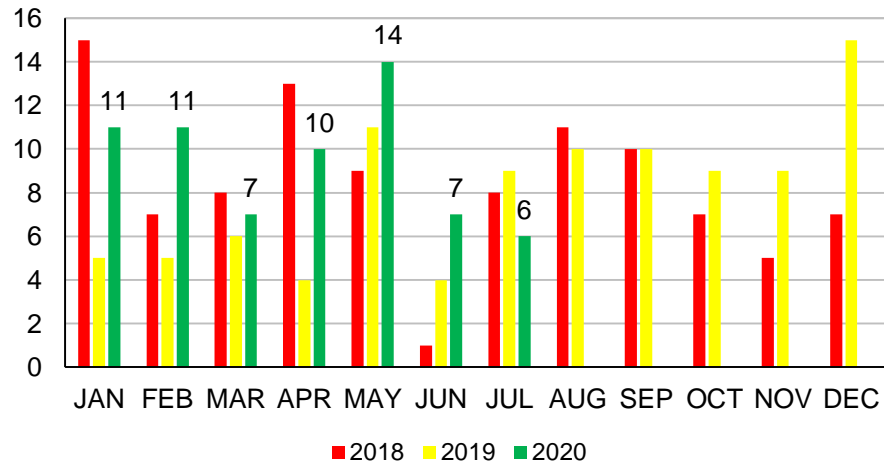

Number of Incidents (2018-2020)



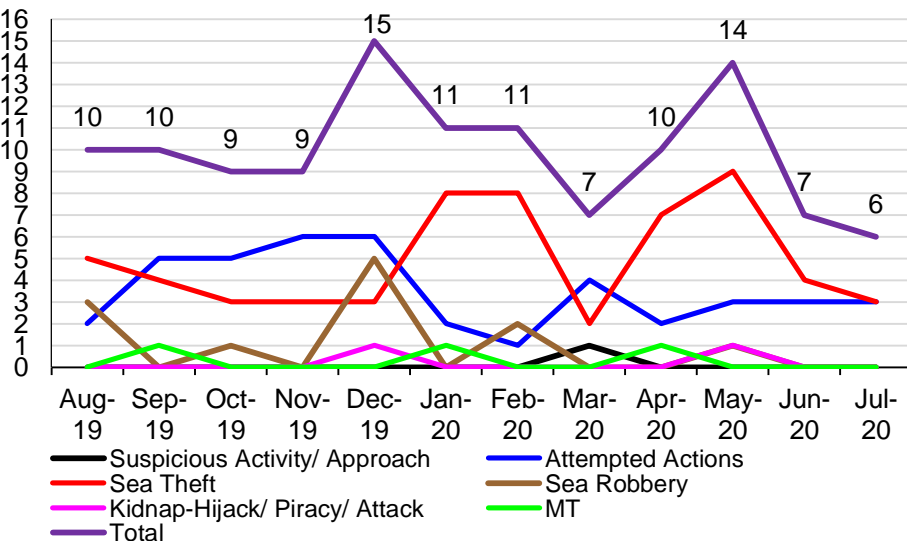
Location of Incidents



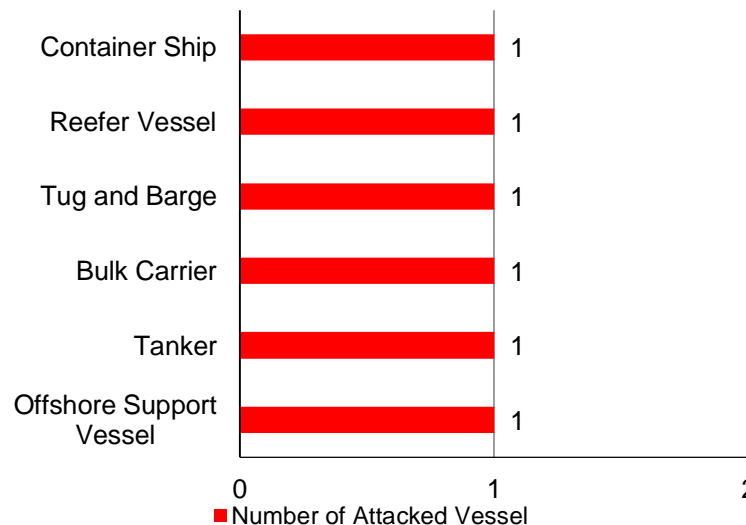
Observations

- IFC recorded six TRAPS incidents (Sea Theft (3), Attempted Action (3)) in Jul 2020. The number of incidents were lower than in Jul 2019 (9) and Jul 2018 (8) and the lowest incidents recorded for this year so far.
- Four incidents occurred while the vessels were underway and two incidents while the vessel either anchored or berthed. Four of the incidents occurred during Period of Darkness (PoD).
- Three incidents were recorded in the Singapore Strait in July, bringing the total number of incidents occurred in Singapore Strait to 22 in 2020. Two Sea Theft incidents occurred onboard underway reefer vessel and bulk carrier respectively in the eastbound lane of TSS during PoD. The last incident prior to these occurred on 28 Jun. Spares were reported stolen in both incidents. These incidents showed a shift of incident location toward furthest east of the strait on the northwest of Bintan Island. Meanwhile, one Attempted Action occurred towards a tug with barge in the westbound lane of TSS, off Tanjung Piai heading to Singapore during daylight. It was the first incident recorded in the westbound lane of TSS in Singapore Strait for this year.
- A Sea Theft incident occurred onboard an anchored container ship in Manila Anchorage, Philippines during PoD. It was the fifth incidents onboard container ships out of seven total incidents in the area this year. The bosun and paint stores padlocks were broken and several ship stores reported stolen. The last recorded incident in this area was on 13 Jun 20.
- An Attempted Action occurred onboard an offshore support vessel while berthed at Kakinada Port, India during PoD. It was the fourth incidents in the area, the third incidents involving offshore support vessel but the first incident recorded onboard a berthed vessel in the area. The perpetrators assessed climbed the jetty fender from under the quay to a blind spot on the main deck area of the vessel. The perpetrators jumped overboard when alarm sounded. No injury to the crew and no item reported stolen. The last recorded incident in this area was on 28 Feb 20.
- An Attempted Action occurred off Natuna Island, Indonesia on an underway tanker during daylight. Two boats with approximately four to six crew were sighted. One of the boat attempted to come alongside and board the tanker. Seeing the approaching boat, the vessel made evasive manoeuvres and directed the Aldis lights towards the boat resulting in the boat aborting and moving away. It has been the first incident off Natuna Island, Indonesia since 2016.

Incident Type (Last 12 months)



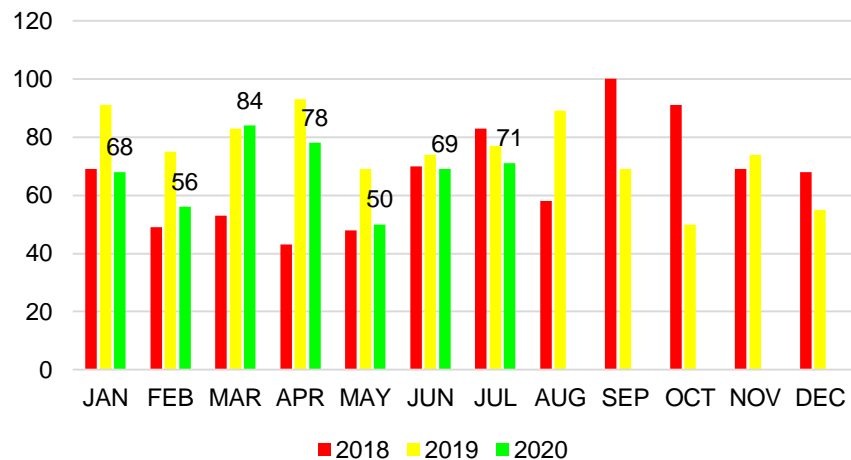
Type of Vessel Attacked



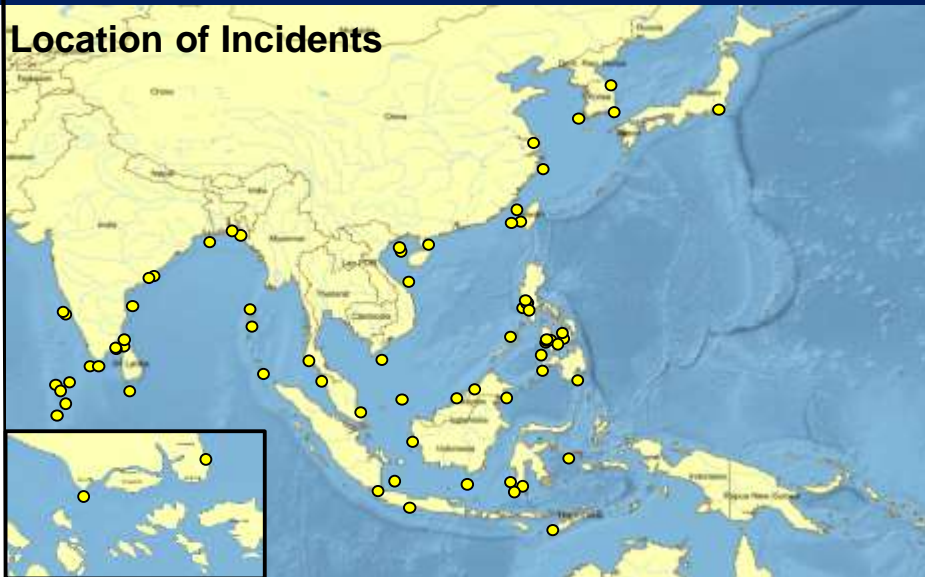

Number of Maritime Incidents



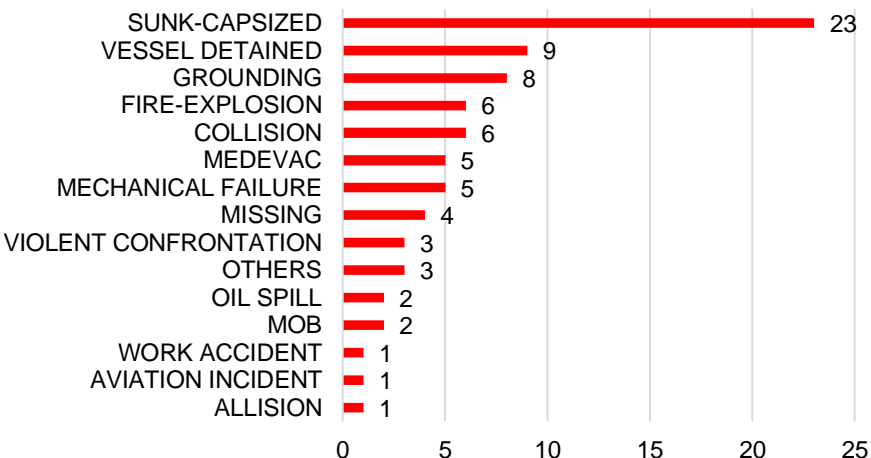

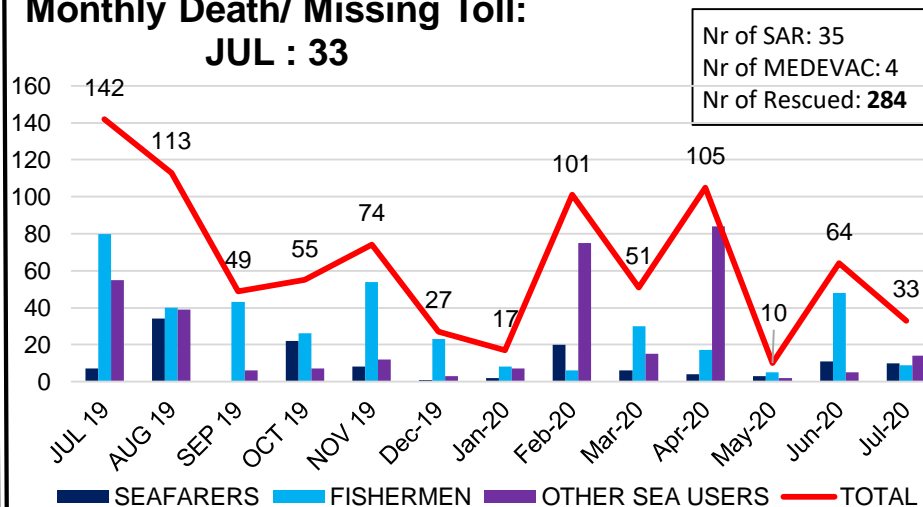
Observations

- **71 maritime incidents** were reported for Jul 20 which is 6% lower than what was recorded in Jul 2019 with 77 incidents and 14% lower than what was recorded in Jul 2018 with 83 incidents. **80** vessels were involved, 33 (41%) are registered vessels (fishing vessel, passenger vessels, tug & barge, tankers, airplane, bulk carriers and other ships). **47** (59%) are unregistered vessels (dredger, tanker, government vessels, small boats, speed boats and fishing vessels).
- **6 Collision** incidents were reported involving 5 registered and 7 unregistered vessels. Causes for all of the incidents are still unknown. Vessels involved similar to Jun 20 are cargo ships and fishing vessels. Three of the incidents eventually lead to sinking.
- Of the **8 Grounding** incidents recorded, 3 were due to bad weather while the rest were due to engine failure, miscalculation and unknown. 6 registered (cargo ship and tug) and 2 unregistered (local passenger and unknown) were involved.
- **23 Sinking or Capsizing** incidents were reported involving 6 registered and 20 unregistered vessels mostly due to bad weather, engine failure, water ingress and still unknown cause. Similar to Jun 2020, small boat, tug, cargo and fishing vessels were involved.
- **9 Vessels** were **Detained** due to maritime safety violations, unauthorized activity, illegal sand dredging, invalid documents and illegal STS. Similar to last month, dredger, tug, fishing vessels, tanker and small boats were involved.
- **6 Fire-Explosion** incidents recorded, 1 was due to electrical failure while the rest are still unknown. 4 Registered and 2 Unregistered vessels were recorded.
- The number of **Deaths** (18) is exactly the same with previous month (18) and lower than Jul 2019 (51).

Types of Maritime Incident



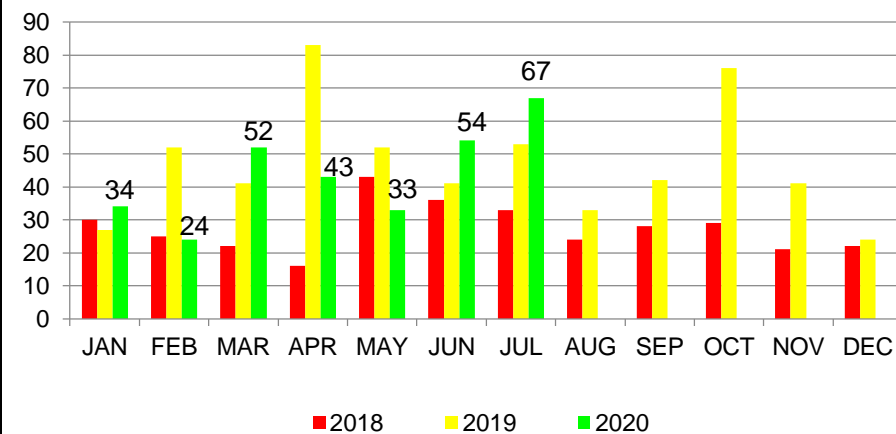

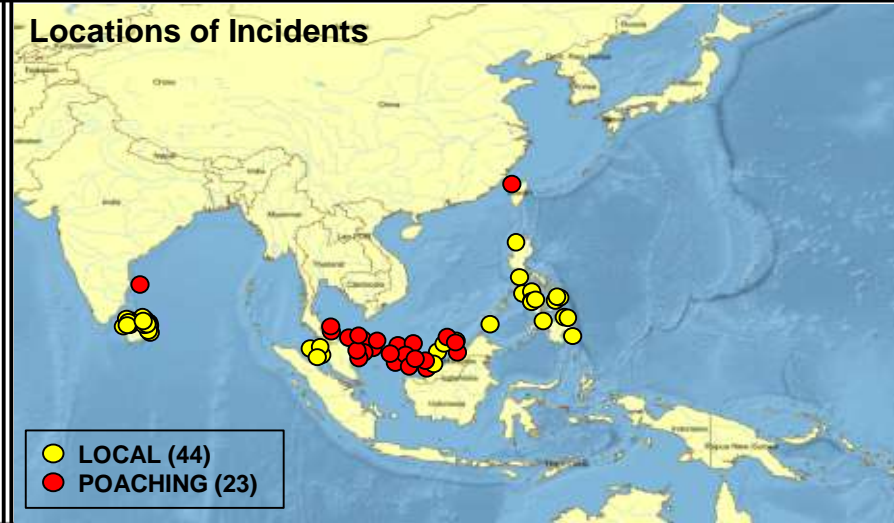


Illegal, Unreported & Unregulated Fishing (IUU Fishing)

Observations

- There were 67 IUU fishing incidents reported in Jul 20, which is 103% (34) and 26.4% (14) higher than in the same period respectively in 2018 (33) and 2019 (53). The incidents number this month was 24.1% (13) higher than Jun 20 (54).
- This increased is likely due to the intensive maritime border control operations during COVID-19 pandemic, especially by Sri Lanka, Philippines, Indonesia, as well as measures taken by Malaysia to resume detaining foreign fishing vessels encroaching Malaysian Waters.

Local

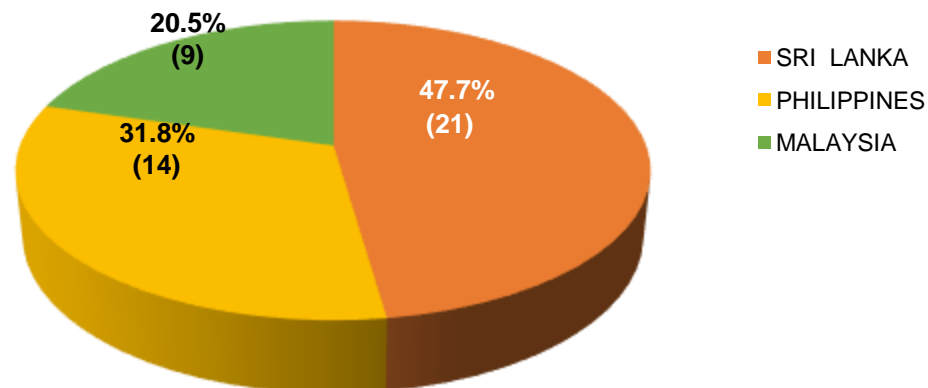
- The number of local IUU fishing incidents recorded in Jul 20 (44) has increased compared to the figures recorded in Jun 2020 (40), Jul 2019 (37) and Jul 2018 (25) respectively.
- 79.5% (35) of the reported local IUU Fishing incidents occurred in the waters of Sri Lanka and Philippines.

Poaching

- The number of IUU fishing incidents involving poaching recorded in Jul 2020 (23) has increased dramatically compared to the figures recorded in Jun 2020 (14), Jul 2019 (15) and Jul 2018 (8) respectively.
- 91.3% (21) of the reported poaching incidents were by Vietnamese fishing vessels.
- 69.6% (16) of the reported poaching incidents occurred in Malaysian waters.

Illegal Practices by Local Vessels or Licensed Foreign Vessels

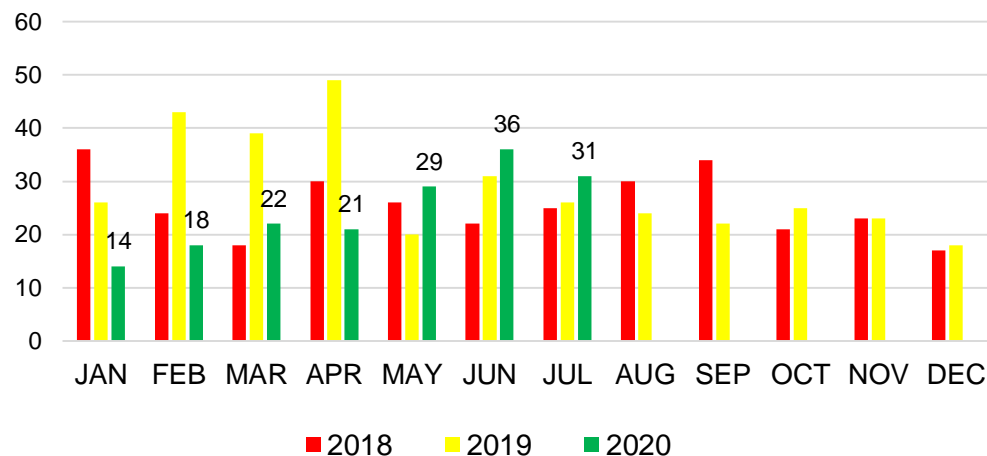
(Countries shown here represent the location of the vessels involved)

Observations

The number of incidents reported this month is higher than those reported during the same period in 2019 and 2018, but is lower than June 2020.

Drugs : 12 incidents

- Two incidents in Indonesia – 157.4 Kg meth and Ecstasy (40,000 pills)
- Malaysia seized two incidents of meth (8.2 Kg) and one of Cannabis (230 Kg), smuggled from Malaysia.
- Vietnam seized 40 Kg meth from a container destined for ROK.
- Four seizures of Cannabis in Sri Lanka (684.3 Kg).
- Two incidents of adrift cannabis seizure off India near Gujrat coast.

Tobacco : 9 incidents

- Five seizures were reported in the Philippines; three in Malaysia of cigarettes. One incident of beedi leaves seizure was reported in India.

Domestic Products : 4 incidents

- One incident was reported in China involving smuggling of electronics and cosmetics from Macau, One incident each of seizure of liquor was reported in Malaysia and Indonesia.
- 1000 Kg of dried turmeric powder seized in Sri Lanka.

Natural Resources : 1 incident

- 2.8 tonnes of Red Sandalwood, in containers bound from ROK to China, seized in Hong Kong.

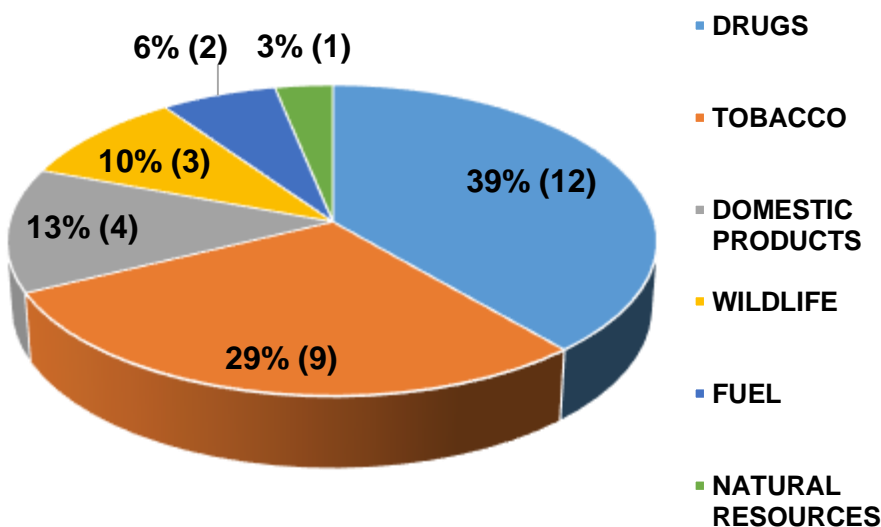
Fuel: 2 incidents

- 50,000 litres of Diesel seized by Thailand from a fishing vessel.
- 640 cans of gasoline was seized from a small cargo vessel in the Philippines.

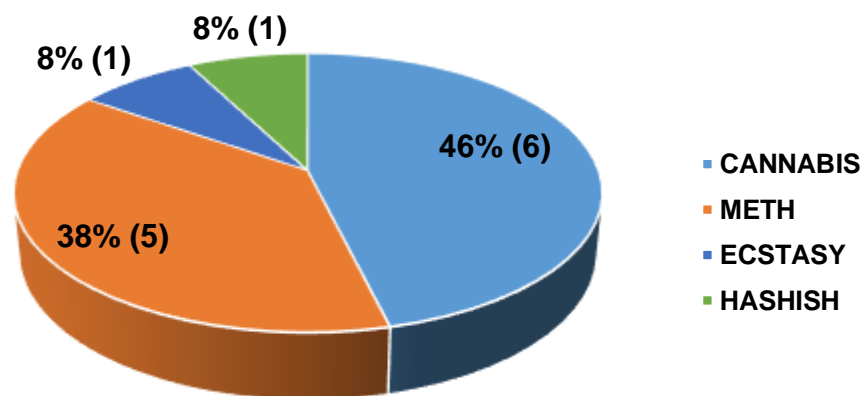
Wildlife: 3 Incidents

Types of Contraband



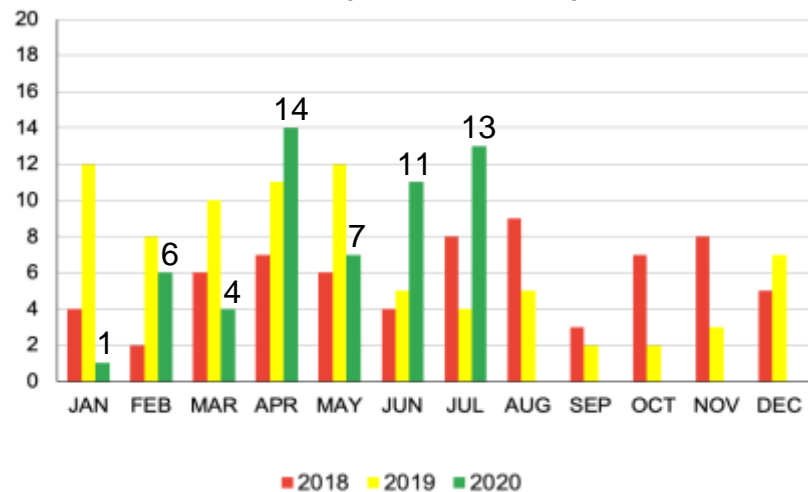
Type of Drug



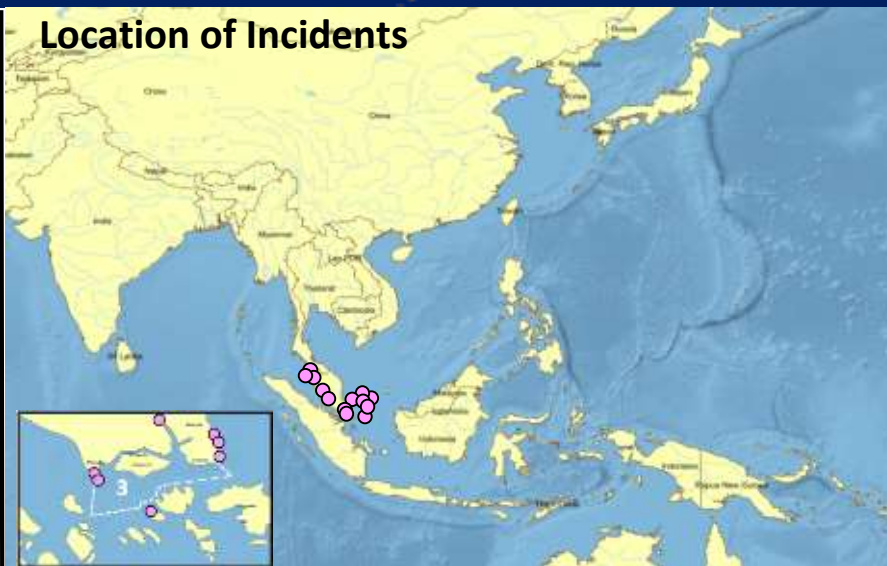


Irregular Human Migration (IHM)

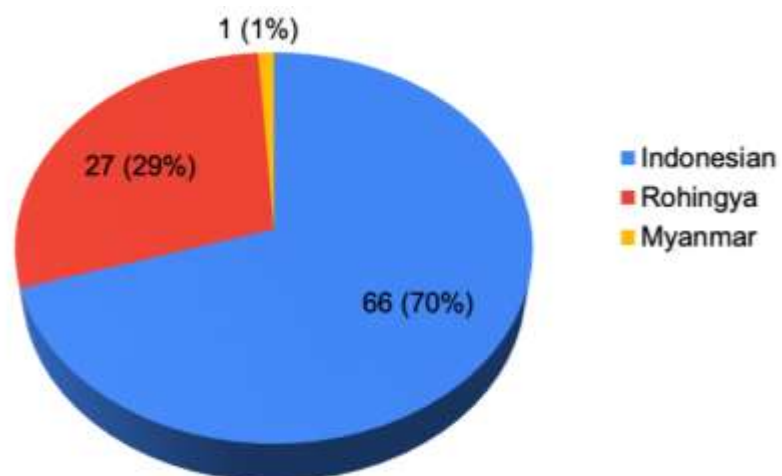
Statistics:

- IHM incidents for July 2020 have increased slightly (13) from June (11) and have increased threefold from July 2019 (4) and July 2018 (8). IFC have observed 12 Human Smuggling and 2 Human Exploitation incidents this month.
- The number of illegal migrants intercepted in July 2020 has decreased to 94 from 767 recorded in June 2020. 66 of the illegal migrants were Indonesians, 27 were Rohingya and 1 was Myanmar.

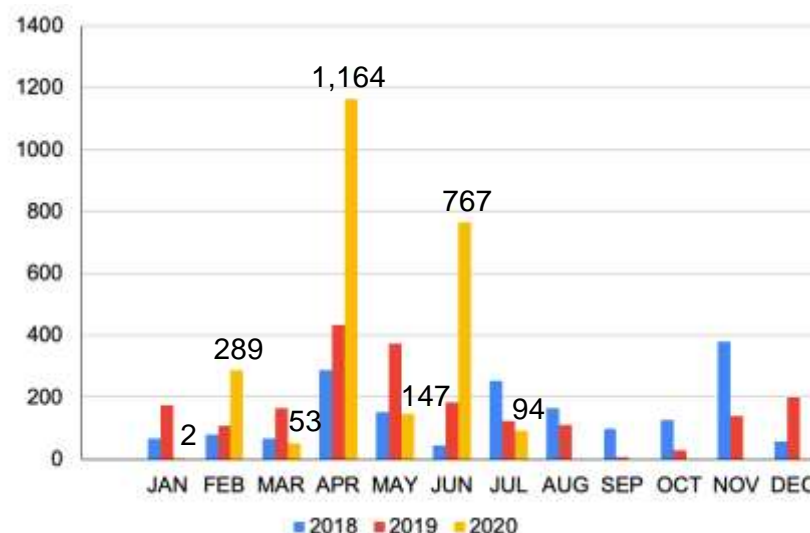
Assessments:

- Large numbers of Indonesian illegal migrants were intercepted off Malaysia this month (66). Only one incident involving Rohingya illegal migrants was recorded.
- Smuggling attempts by networks have been intercepted by Malaysian authorities under 'Op Benteng' throughout July.
- In one of the Human Exploitation incidents, reports revealed the death of one Indonesian migrant due to abuse onboard a Chinese vessel off Indonesian waters. Indonesian authorities have since charged several people in relation to the alleged torturing to death of the Indonesian migrant. In another investigation, recruiting agency bosses faced human trafficking charges for illegal recruitment and deceiving victims with false employment opportunities.

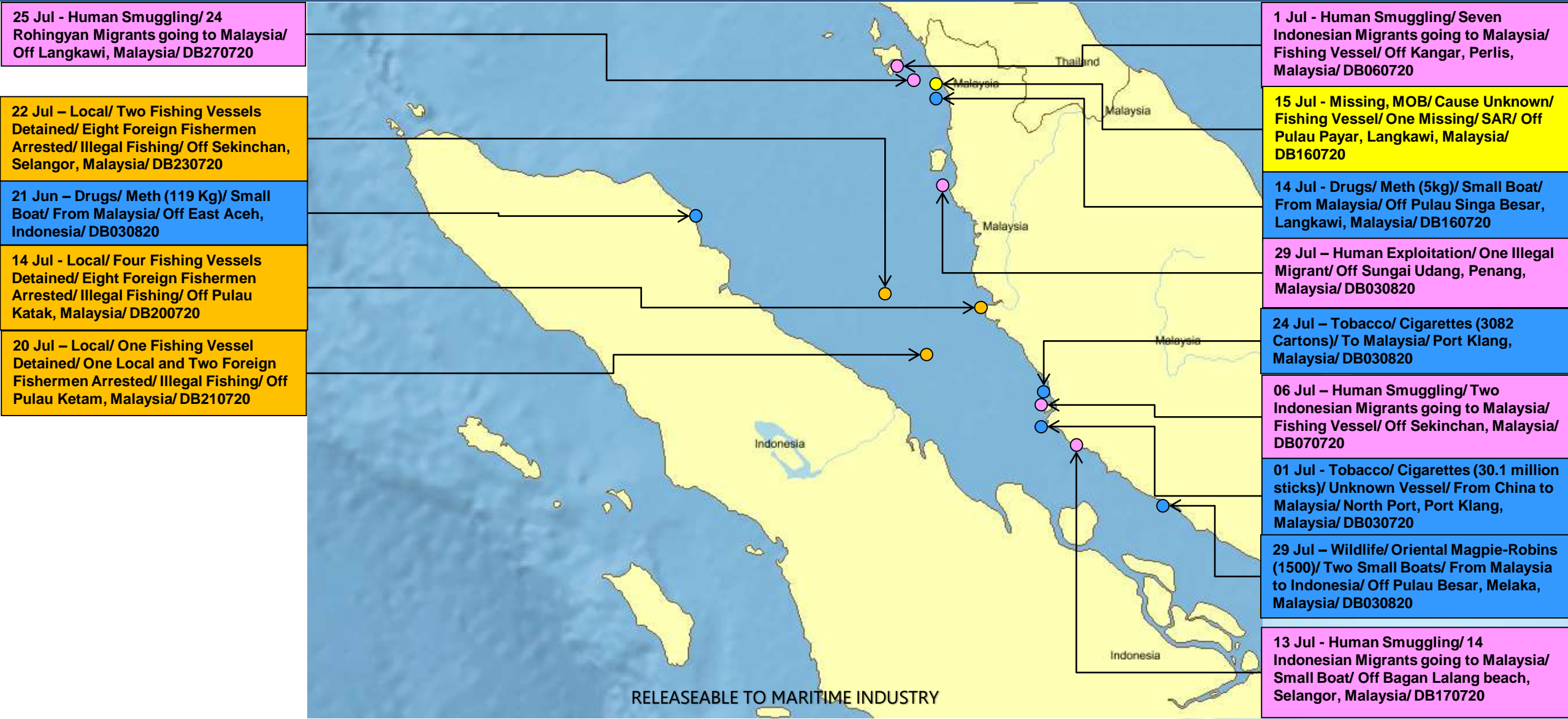
Nationality/Ethnicity of Migrants

IFC Recommendations

The IFC advises:

1. All mariners to report any incidents timely to the nearest coastal state and to the IFC at the earliest possible time.
2. Ships moving at slow speed or are choosing to remain at anchor in areas where sea robbery/theft is regularly reported should remain vigilant and adopt necessary and/or added security measures.
3. All mariners to take note on the description of the perpetrators and to take photos of the perpetrators if possible. Where available, CCTV footage capturing the incident should be provided to the coastal state authorities for follow-on investigation.
4. Shippers and Seafarers operating in the Sulu-Celebes seas are strongly recommended to be vigilant and to establish contact with the Philippines, Malaysian and Indonesian Authorities to report their presence. Please refer to IFC Spot Commentary 4/18 for the latest assessment of the situation in that affected area.
5. Shippers are advised to take note that the threat of terrorist activity in the maritime domain remains a possibility in the region due to ISIS and the Al-Qaeda. The possibility of this threat was previously quoted in Al-Qaeda's online magazine "Resurgence", which called for the disruption of global trade and shipping through acts of piracy, among other tactics. Shippers are therefore advised to exercise vigilance and to adopt self-defensive measures as stated in the Regional Guide to Counter Piracy and Armed Robbery against Ships in Asia, especially when transiting narrow choke points and areas which are known to have experienced incidents of sea robbery/piracy.
