Overview of MARSEC Incidents in the Singapore Strait

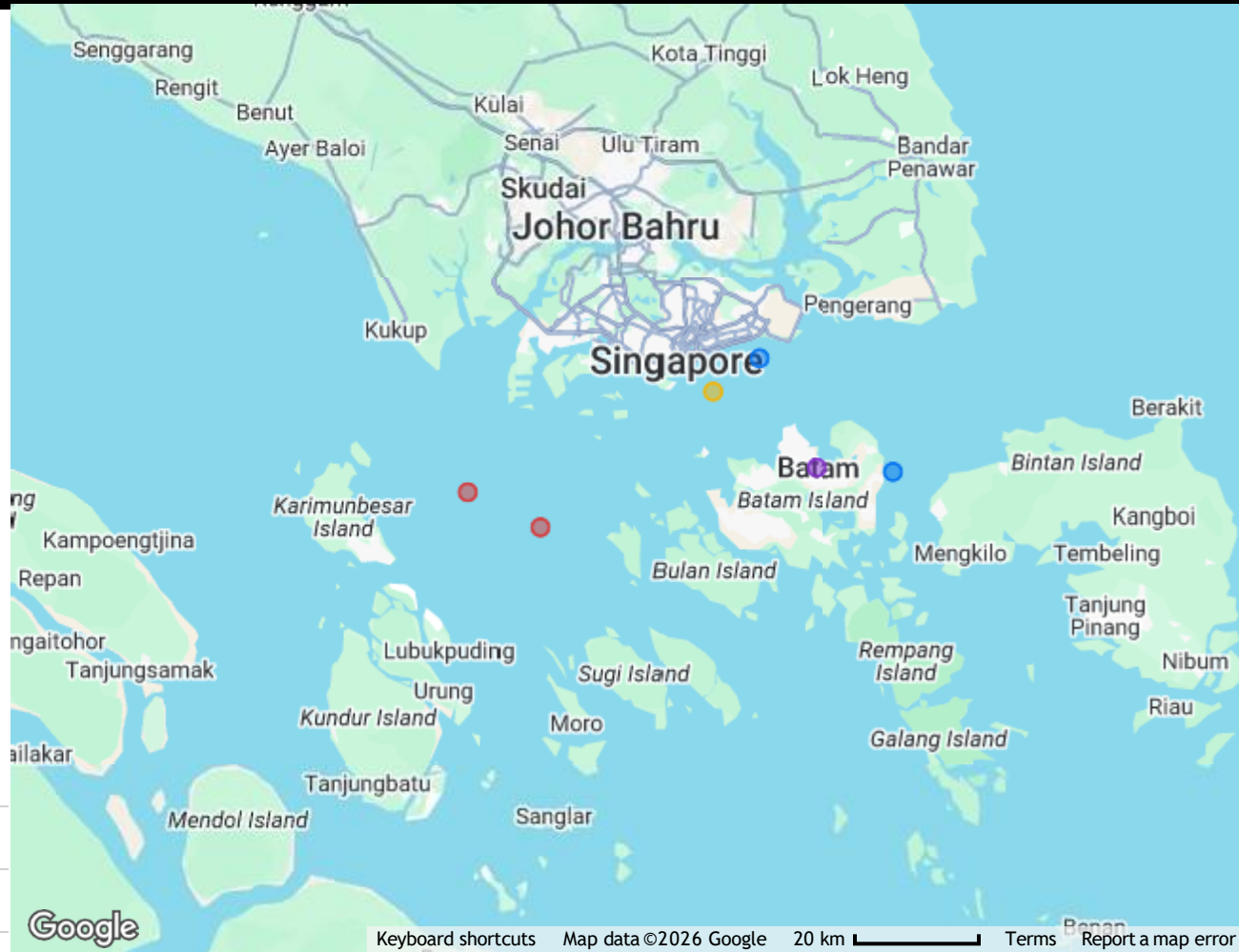

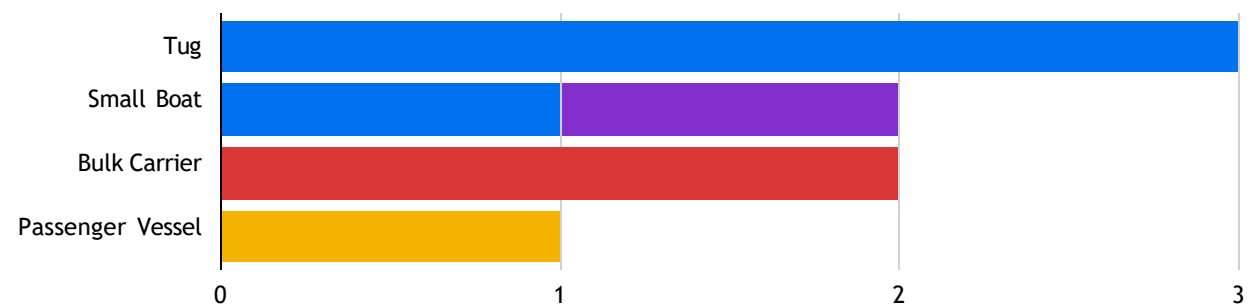

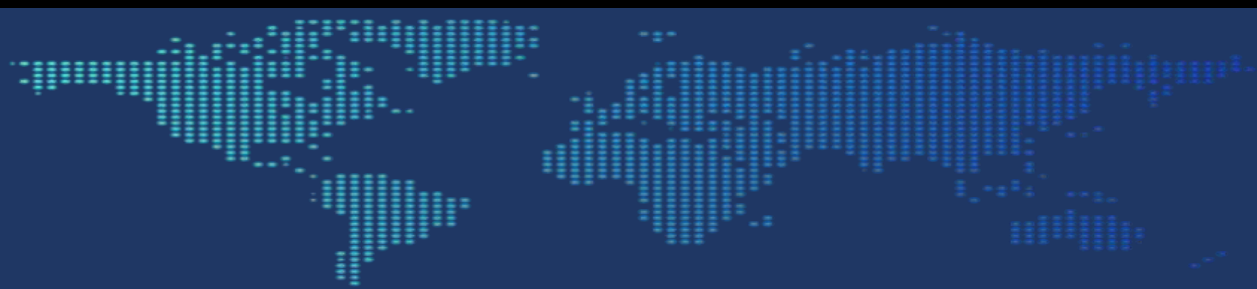


Number of Vessels





Executive Summary



Theft, Robbery and Piracy at Sea: 2 TRAPS incidents were reported in Feb 2026. This is a major decrease as compared to 2025 (13) and 2024 (14). Of note, the 2 incidents were reported in Singapore Strait.

Maritime Incidents: 43 MI incidents were reported in Feb 2026. Bad Weather is the most commonly reported cause of incident this month which accounts for (10) of the (43) incidents.

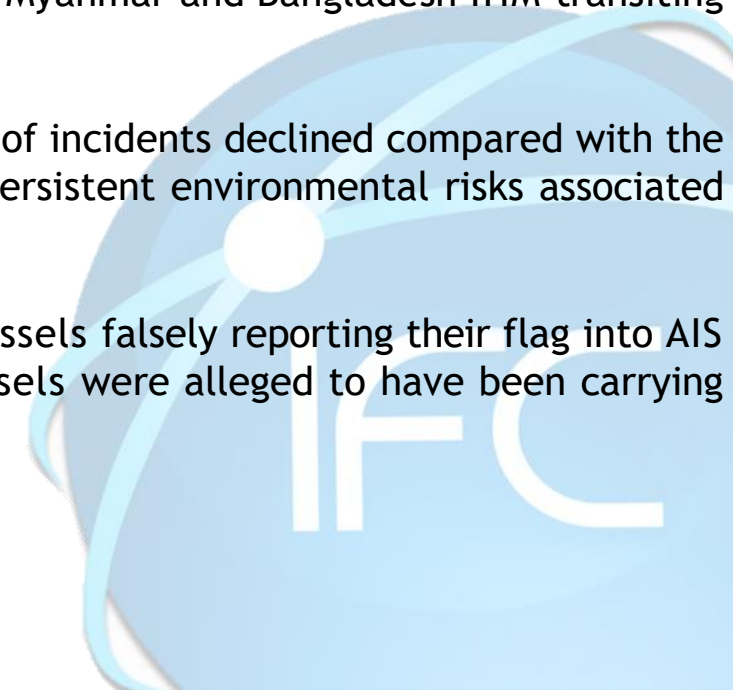
Illegal, Unreported, and Unregulated Fishing: 39 IUUFF incidents were reported in Feb 2026. There has been gradual decline in incidents view sustained operations by law enforcement agencies.

Contraband Smuggling: 49 CS incidents were reported in Feb 2026. Domestic-product smuggling continued to account for the largest share of incidents, with Bangladesh and Indonesia recording the majority of cases, likely driven by sustained demand for daily-use goods within cross-border communities.

Irregular Human Migration: 5 IHM incidents were reported in Feb 2026. 2 incidents involved Myanmar and Bangladesh IHM transiting to Malaysia, 1 from Myanmar and 1 from Thailand after having entered overland.

Environmental Security: 2 ENVSEC incidents were reported in Feb 2026. While the number of incidents declined compared with the previous months, the presence of pollution cases involving cargo vessels highlights the persistent environmental risks associated with high-density shipping routes.

Cyber Security: 2 CYBSEC incidents were reported in Feb 2026. Both incidents involved vessels falsely reporting their flag into AIS while transiting the IFC AOR. Both vessels were stateless and unregistered, and both vessels were alleged to have been carrying goods sanctioned by the USA.

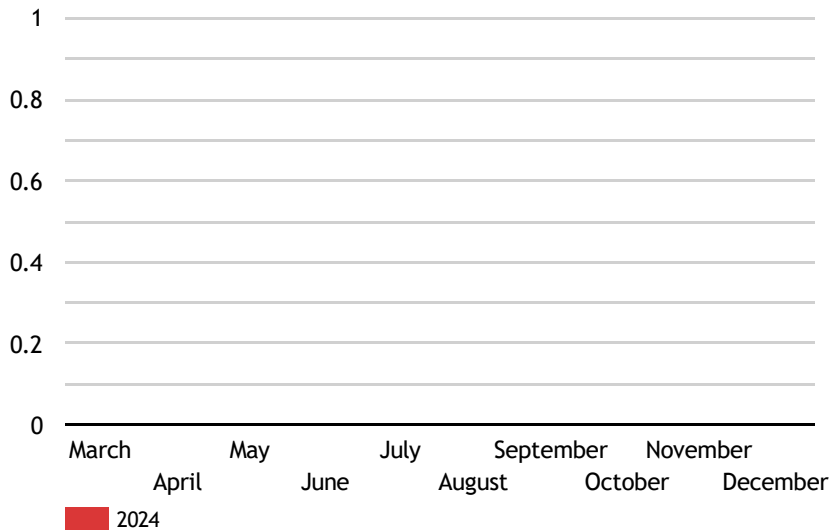

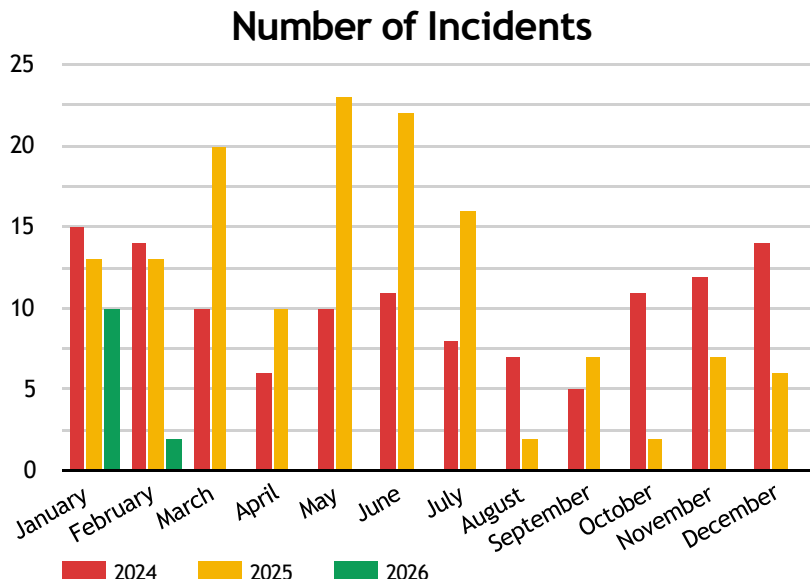
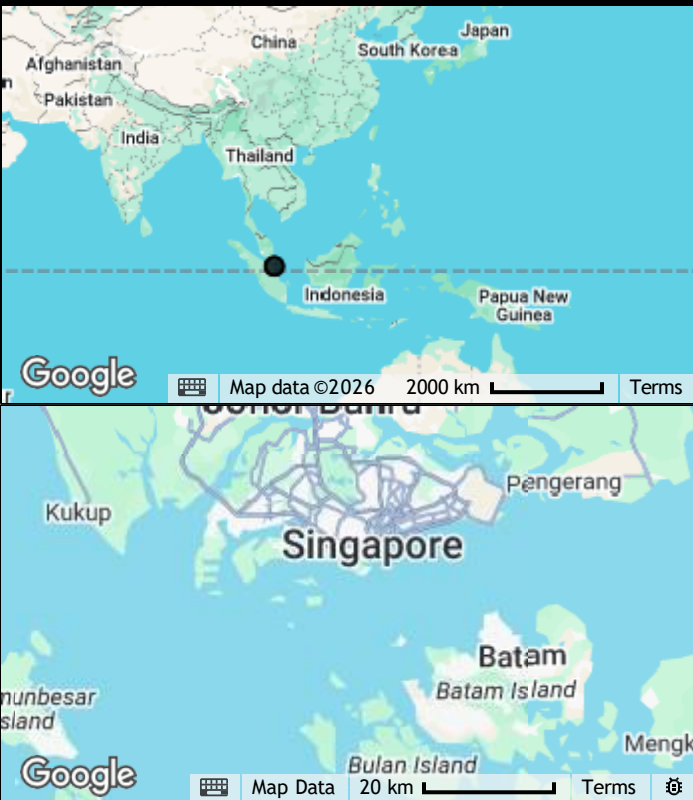

OBSERVATIONS

Statistics.

- Total of 2 (Boarding) TRAPS incidents reported in Feb 2026, represented a decrease compared to the same period in 2025 (13) and 2024 (14).

- Both incidents occurred in hours of darkness, which is consistent with past observations where perpetrators tend to conduct boardings in the Phillip Channel under the cover of darkness to avoid detection. No reports of confrontation nor injury.

Singapore Strait.

- Total 2 incidents (Sea Theft) reported - both incidents occurred in Phillip Channel.

- Both incidents involved Bulk Carriers. Of note, in one incident, perpetrators were reportedly armed with knives and stole a mobile device.
- For both incidents, no confrontation nor injuries reported. The ships were able to continue their voyages to the next port without requiring any assistance.

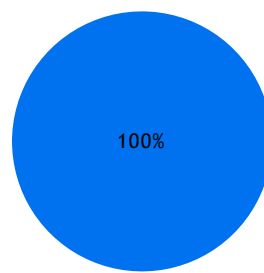
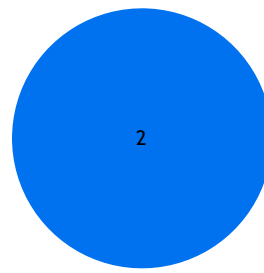
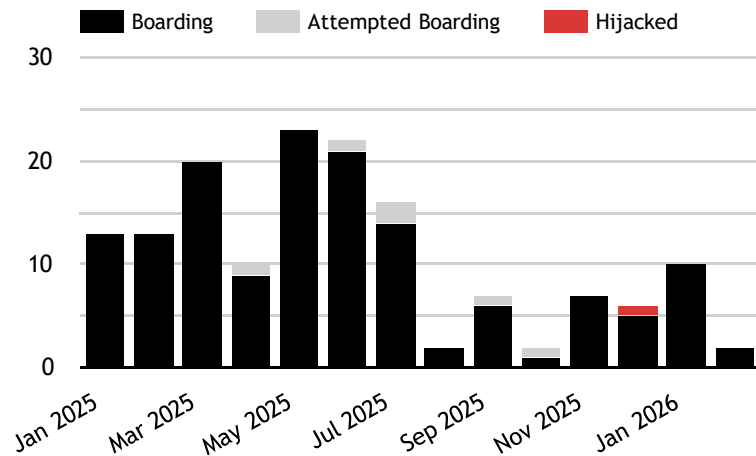
Comments.

- Based on past trends, there is a risk of increasing incident numbers in March due to the combined effects of (a) prevailing Northeast Monsoon, resulting in unfavourable fishing conditions in the South China Sea; and (b) increased financial obligations due to festivities, causing locals to resort to petty crime to supplement their income.

- While regional authorities remain committed to step up enforcement efforts to keep incident numbers low, all vessels are strongly advised to maintain heightened vigilance and implement necessary ship protection measures at all times. When opportune, ship masters are encouraged to capture and provide evidence of the incident(s) to support follow-on investigations.

- Modus operandi remained largely consistent with petty crime, and are opportunistic in nature (majority no confrontation reported).
- All companies, sea users, and ship masters are advised to remain vigilant when transiting known areas of concern, Phillip Channel, waters off Batam and Bintan islands.

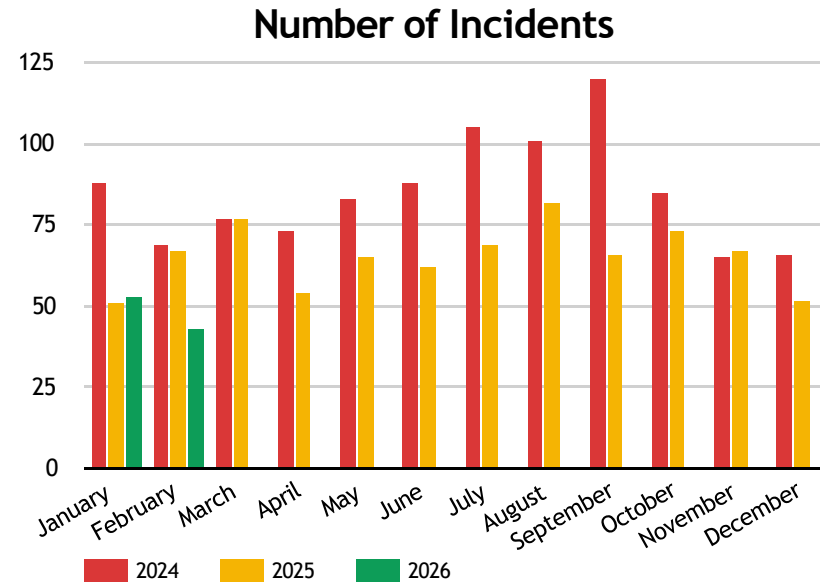
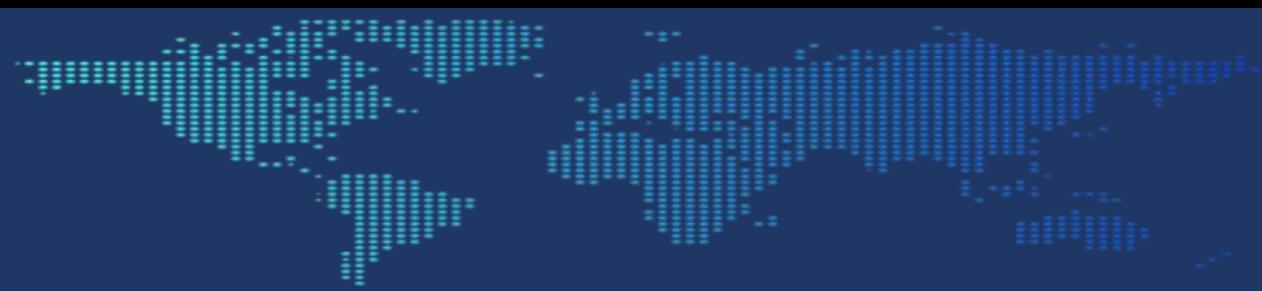

OBSERVATIONS

Statistics:

- A total of (43) Maritime incidents were reported this month, which is lower than the number recorded in the same period in 2025 (67) and in 2024 (69).

- The largest number of reported incidents was sunk-capsized (14), followed by Vessel Detained (8), then Fire-Explosion, Collision-grounding, and Adrift with (5) each incident.

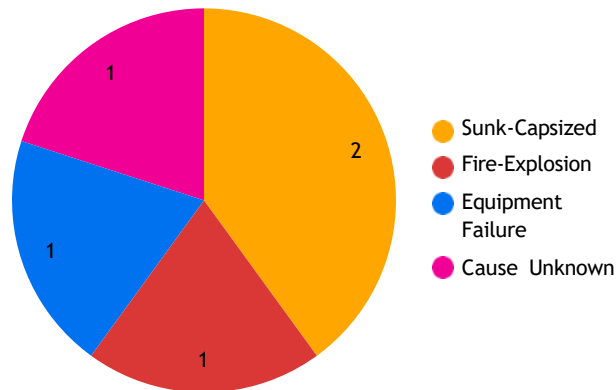
- In terms of location, the highest number of reported incidents occurred in the waters of Philippines (11), followed by Indonesia (8), then ROK (6) and Malaysia (4).

- A total of (22) individuals were reported dead or missing this month, which is the same as the last month (22). Overall, (31) SAR operations were conducted, resulting in the rescue of (1,647) individuals. The number of rescues increased compared to the previous month, mainly due to three major incidents: 611 people were rescued from a passenger vessel fire at Raffles Reserved Anchorage, Singapore, on February 20; 246 people were rescued from a passenger vessel that sank near Makian Village, Indonesia, on the 17th; and 225 people were rescued from a passenger vessel that experienced a steering casualty off Pangasahan Island, Philippines, on the 2nd.

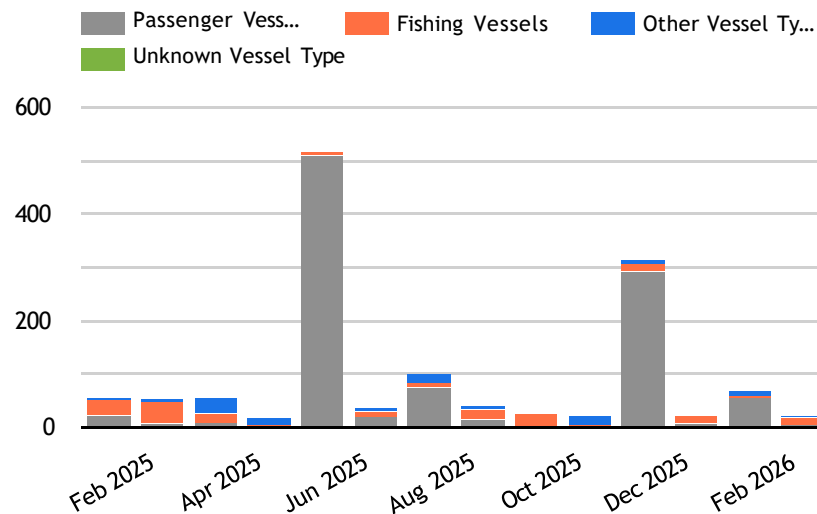

Number of Vessels, by Type of Incident

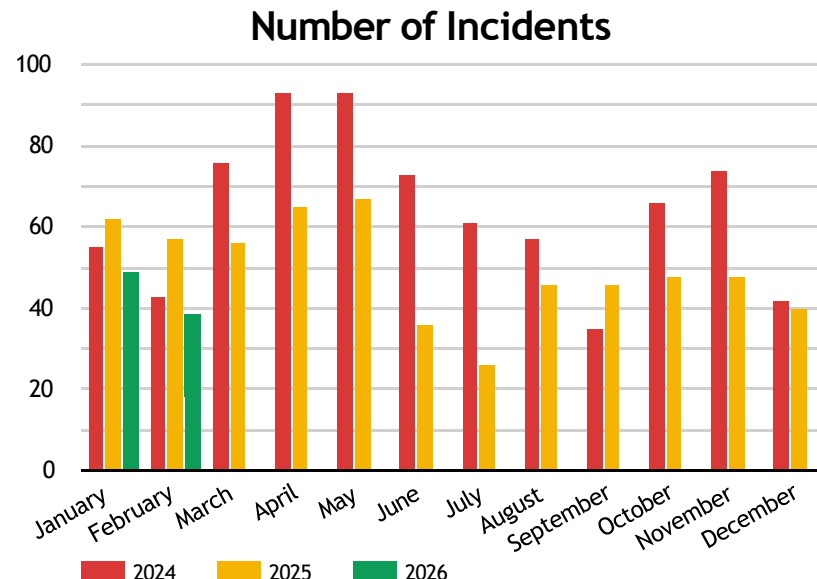

Illegal, Unreported, and Unregulated Fishing (IUUF)



OBSERVATIONS

Statistics :

- A total of 39 IUUF incidents were recorded in Feb 26, representing a decrease from Feb 25 (59 incidents). The figure remains slightly lower than Jan 26 (50 incidents) but higher than Feb 24 (43 incidents), indicating a moderate decline following the spike observed in Feb 25, despite normal monthly fluctuations.

- Local: A total of 20 local IUUF incidents were recorded in Feb 26, representing a decrease from Feb 25 (34 incidents) and Jan 26 (31 incidents), while also falling below Feb 24 (27 incidents). This suggests a decline in locally driven IUUF activities during the reporting period.

- Most local incidents occurred in Malaysia (6 incidents; 30%), followed by Sri Lanka (5 incidents; 25%) and ROK (4 incidents; 20%). Sabah and India recorded 2 incidents each (10%), while the Philippines recorded 1 incident (5%), highlighting Malaysia as the primary hotspot for local IUUF activities.

- Poaching: A total of 19 poaching IUUF incidents were recorded in Feb 26, representing a decrease from Feb 25 (25 incidents) but slightly higher than Feb 24 (16 incidents). The figure remains consistent with Jan 26 (19 incidents), indicating relatively stable poaching activity despite short-term fluctuations.

- Poaching incidents were mainly associated with vessels flagged to Indonesia (6 incidents; 31.6%), followed by India (5 incidents; 26.3%) and unidentified vessels (#N/A) (3 incidents; 15.8%). Thailand and Sri Lanka recorded 2 incidents each (10.5%), while Bangladesh recorded 1 incident (5.3%), highlighting Indonesia as the primary source of vessels involved in poaching IUUF activities.

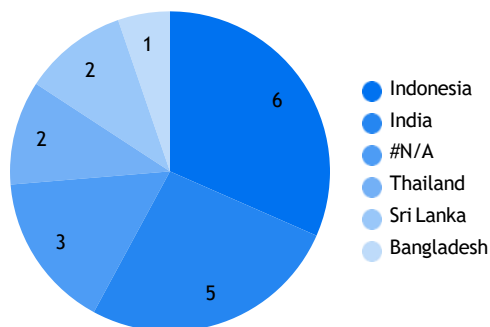
Comments :

- Overall, IUUF incidents declined in Feb 26 following the spike observed in Feb 25, although local violations remain the dominant category. The concentration of local incidents in Malaysia and poaching cases linked mainly to Indonesia-flagged vessels highlights persistent hotspot areas and ongoing cross-border fishing pressures. Targeted monitoring, sustained enforcement, and strengthened regional information sharing will remain essential to deter recurring violations and enhance regional maritime resource protection.

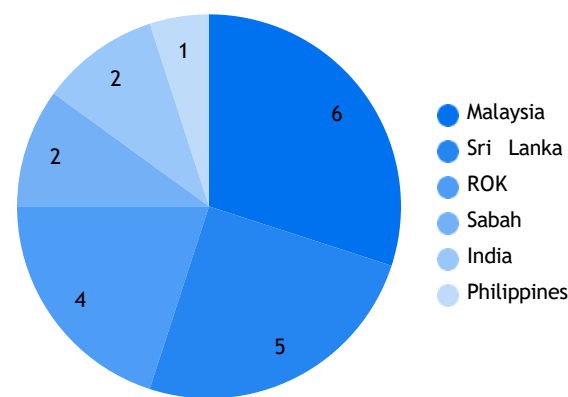

Number and Flag of Vessels, Poaching

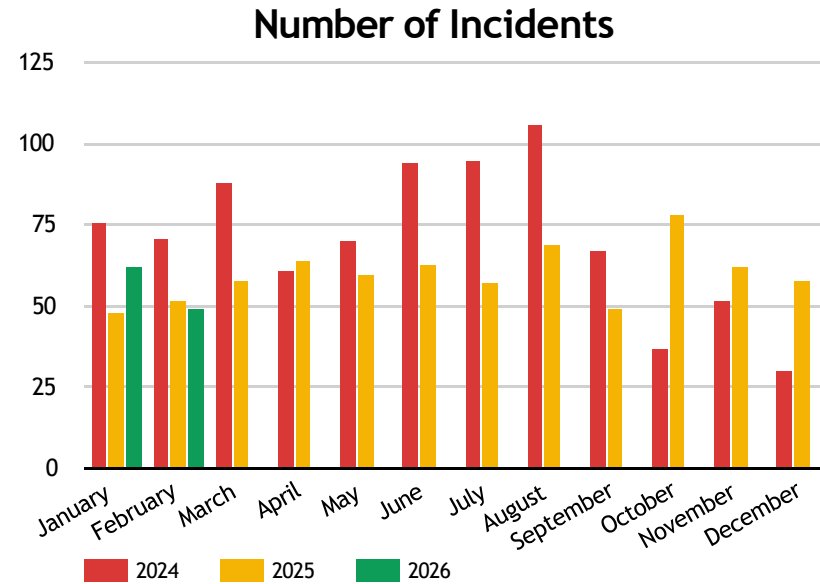


Number and Flag of Vessels, Local





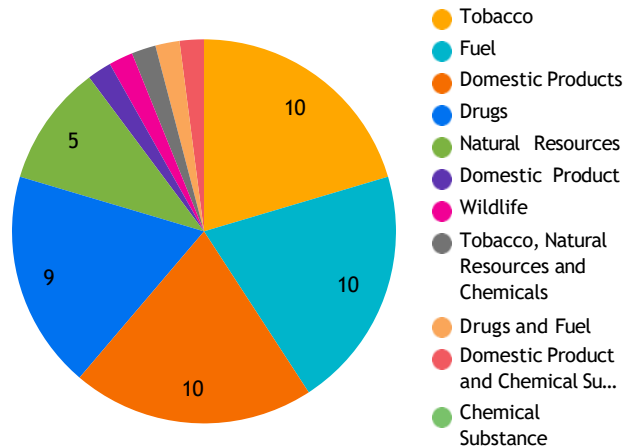

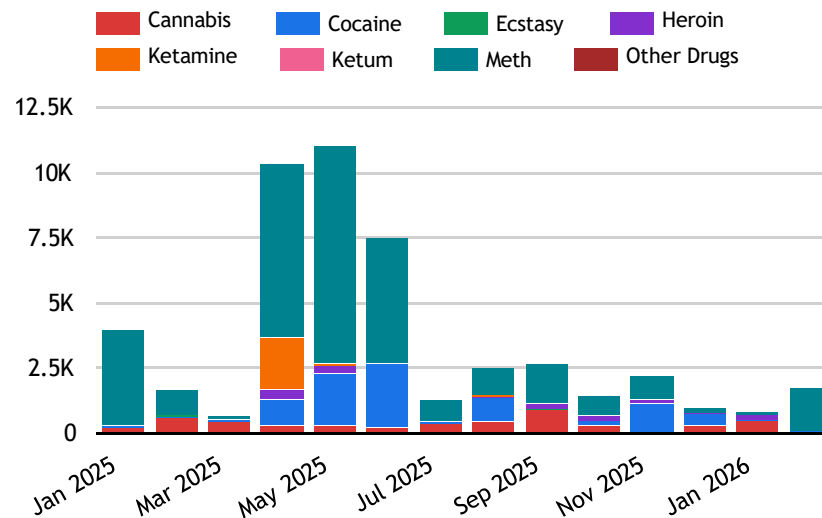

OBSERVATIONS

Statistics:

A total of 49 CS incidents were reported in Feb 2026. This represented a decrease compared to the same period in 2025 (52 incidents) and Feb 2024 (71 incidents). Overall incident levels remained broadly consistent with those recorded in Jan 2026, indicating a sustained elevated level of smuggling activity rather than a short-term fluctuation.

Drugs (x9): Bangladesh (x3 Meth 650,000 pills), Australia (x2 Cocaine 28kg, Meth 26kg), India (Unknown drugs 203kg), Maldives (Hashish 36.4kg), Malaysia (cannabis 50kg), Philippines (Meth 41kg).

Domestic Products (x10): Bangladesh (x3), Malaysia (x2), Indonesia (x2), China (x1), India (x1), Thailand (x1).

Fuel (x10): Malaysia (x2), Sabah (x2), Thailand (x2), Indonesia (x2), Singapore (x1), India (x1).

Tobacco (x10): Philippines (x8), India (x1), Sri Lanka (x1).

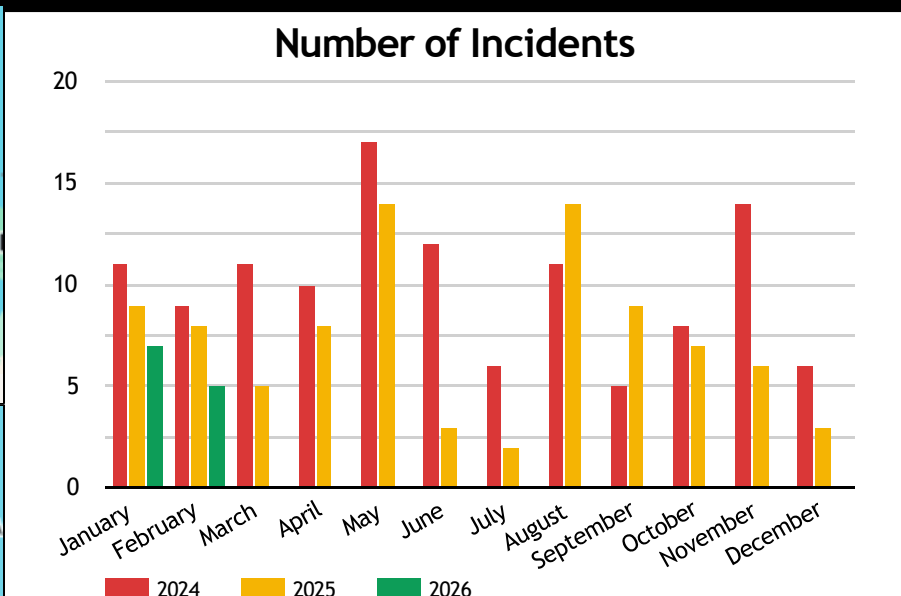

Comments:

- The IFC assessed that CS incident levels in Feb 2026 decreased compared to Feb 2025, but remained well below the peak levels observed in Feb 2024, suggesting partial recovery from last year's lower baseline rather than a return to previous highs.
- Domestic-product smuggling continued to account for the largest share of incidents, with Bangladesh and Indonesia recording the majority of cases, likely driven by sustained demand for daily-use goods within cross-border communities.
- Drug-smuggling activity increased to nine incidents compared to last time seven incidents. Bangladesh has been the top destination for Meth smuggling recently, this drug was reportedly originated from the Golden Triangle.
- Fuel-smuggling activity saw an increase consistent with the previous month's figures while Natural resources dropped significantly from 15 incidents the previous month to five incidents this month.

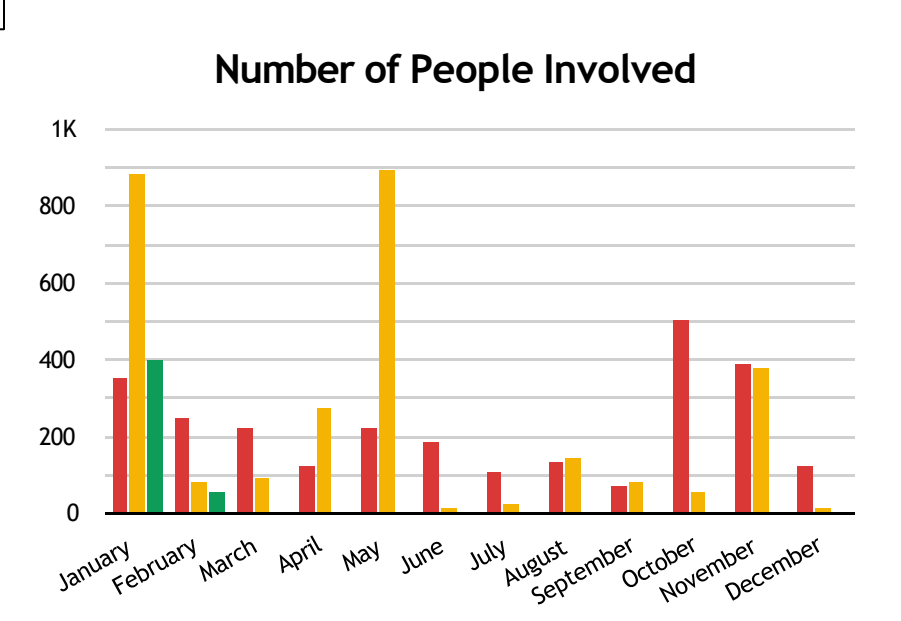

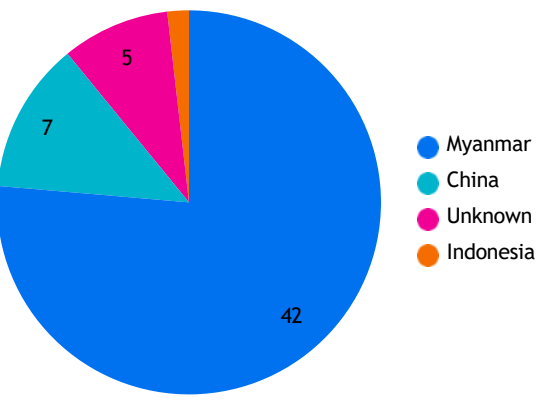
Statistics:

- There were a total of 5 IHM incidents reported in Feb 2026, all classified as routine Irregular Human Migration.

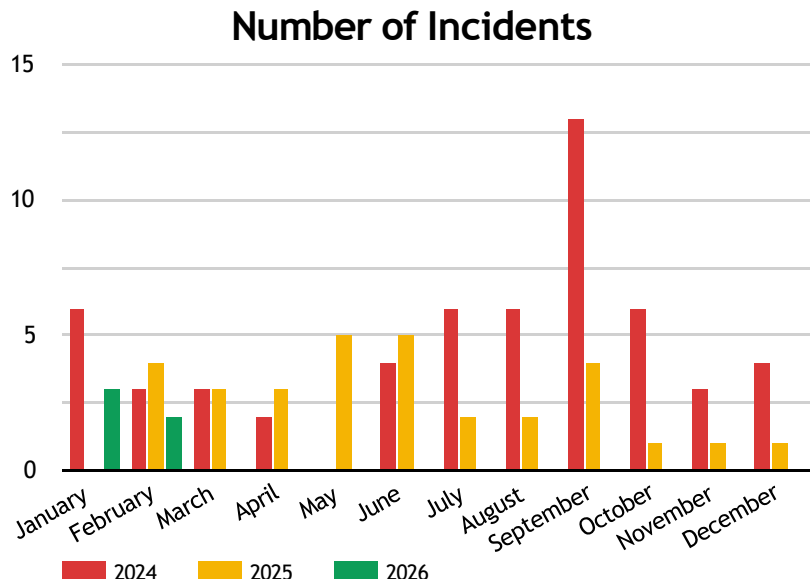
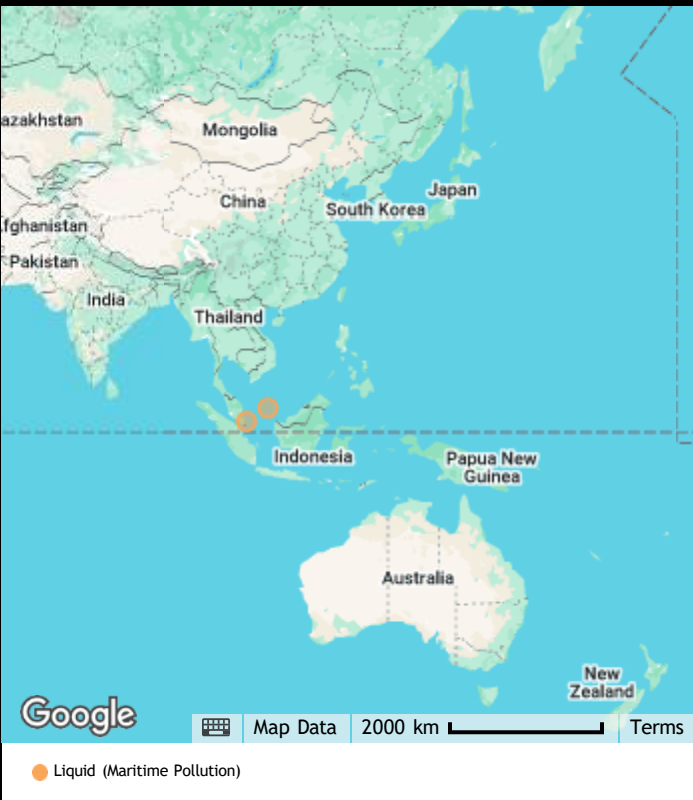
- 2 incidents occurred along the south coast of Indonesia, involving extra-regional foreign nationals being arrested attempting to leave Indonesia illegally - likely transiting to Australia.
- 2 incidents involved Myanmar and Bangladesh IHM transiting to Malaysia, one from Myanmar and 1 from Thailand after having entered overland.
- The final incident involved routine migrant workers transiting in small boats between Indonesia and Malaysia.
- While incidents remain within expected numbers, there is a notable decrease in IHM people this month. There was no large-scale venture this month, driving numbers down. It is likely that there will be at least one large scale IHM venture in the Bay of Bengal before the weather worsens during the mid-year monsoon season.

Environmental Security (ENVSEC)



OBSERVATIONS

Statistics :

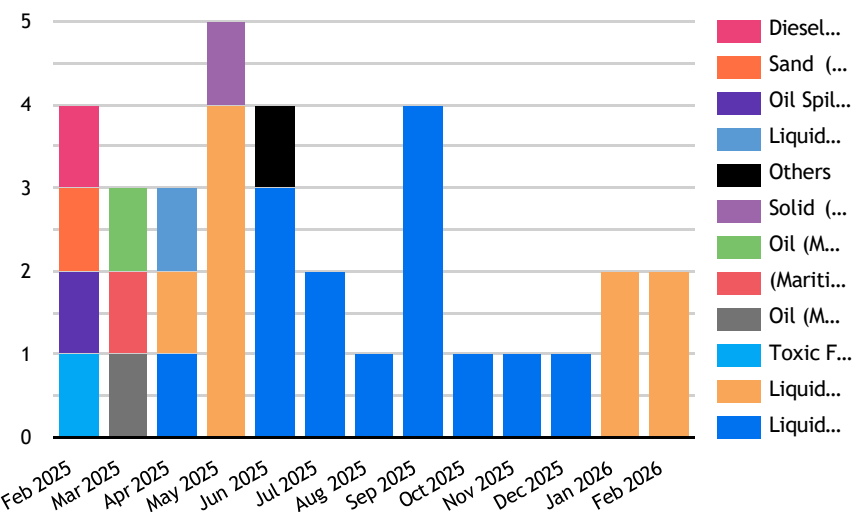
- A total of 2 ENVSEC incidents were reported in Feb 26, representing a decrease compared with Feb 25 (5 incidents) and Feb 24 (3 incidents), while showing an increase from Jan 26 (0 incidents). Overall, the data indicates that environmental security incidents remain relatively limited across the reporting period, despite minor month-to-month fluctuations. The decline from the previous months suggests a temporary reduction in reported environmental-related maritime incidents, although continued monitoring remains important given the potential environmental impact of such events.

Maritime Pollution (MARPOL) : A total of 2 incidents were recorded in Feb 26, both occurring in the ROK area and involving cargo vessels. This reflects a decrease compared with Feb 25 (5 incidents) and Feb 24 (3 incidents), while representing an increase from Jan 26 (0 incidents). The sources of pollution were attributed to one unknown vessel and one unclassified vessel, indicating challenges in vessel identification during incident reporting. Although the overall number of cases remains limited, the occurrence of ship-source pollution incidents within a busy maritime area such as the ROK underscores the continued environmental risks associated with high-density shipping routes.

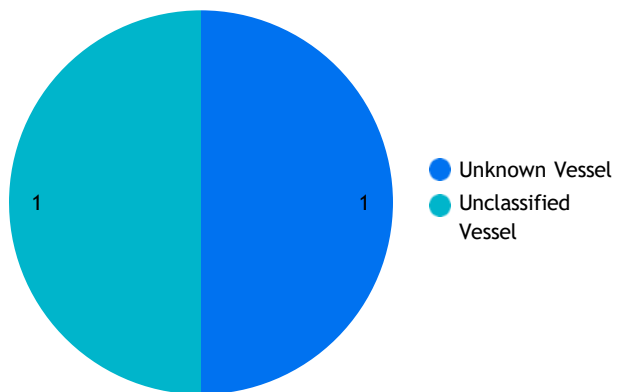

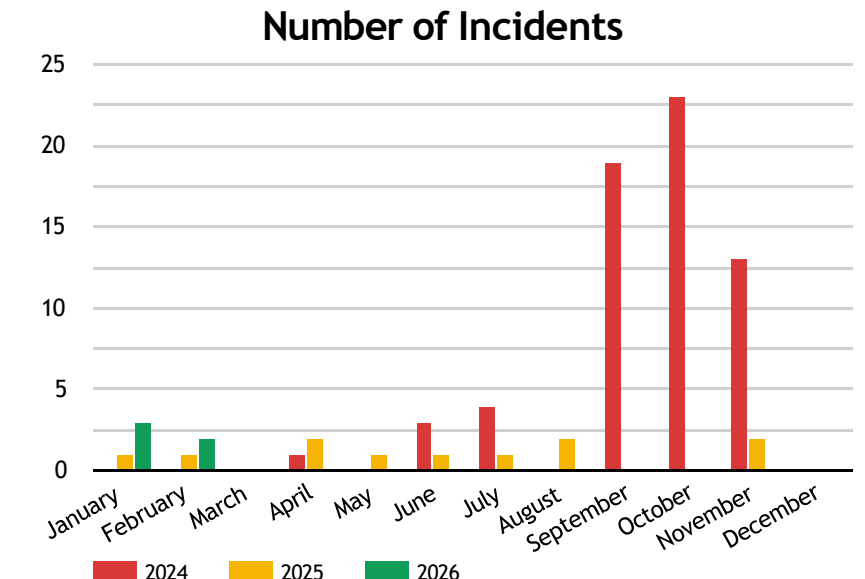
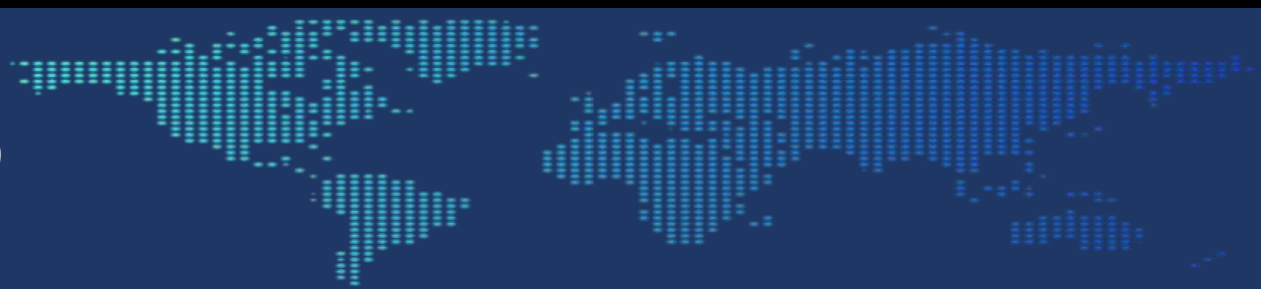

Comments :

- Overall, ENVSEC incidents remained relatively limited in Feb 26, with cases solely linked to ship-source maritime pollution in the ROK area. While the number of incidents declined compared with the previous months, the presence of pollution cases involving cargo vessels highlights the persistent environmental risks associated with high-density shipping routes. Continued monitoring, effective reporting, and regional cooperation will remain important to support timely response and mitigate potential impacts on the marine environment.

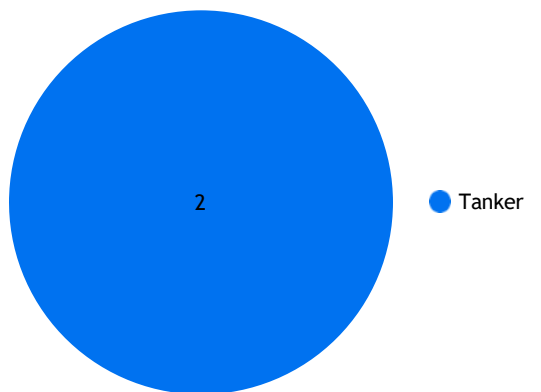
Note:

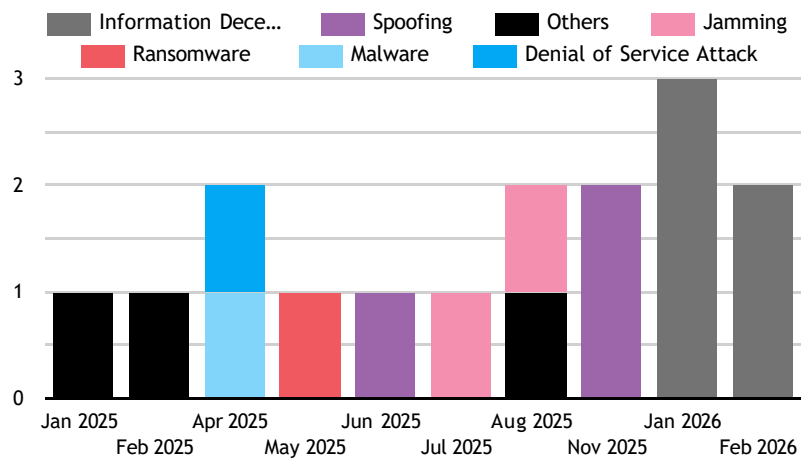

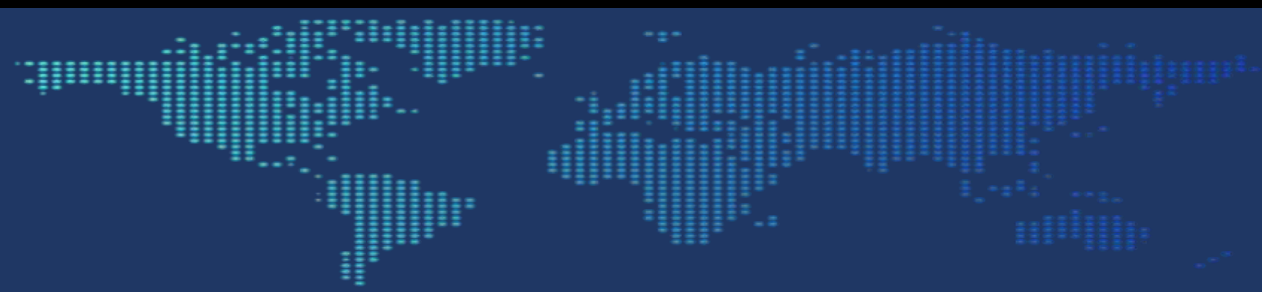


Types of Incident

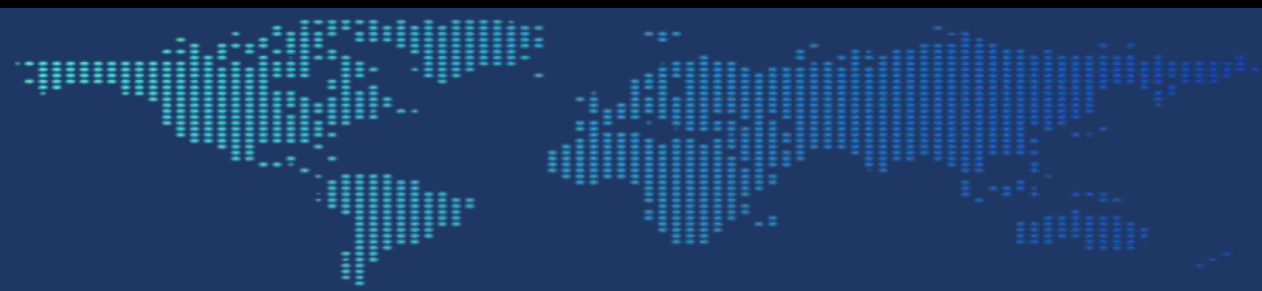

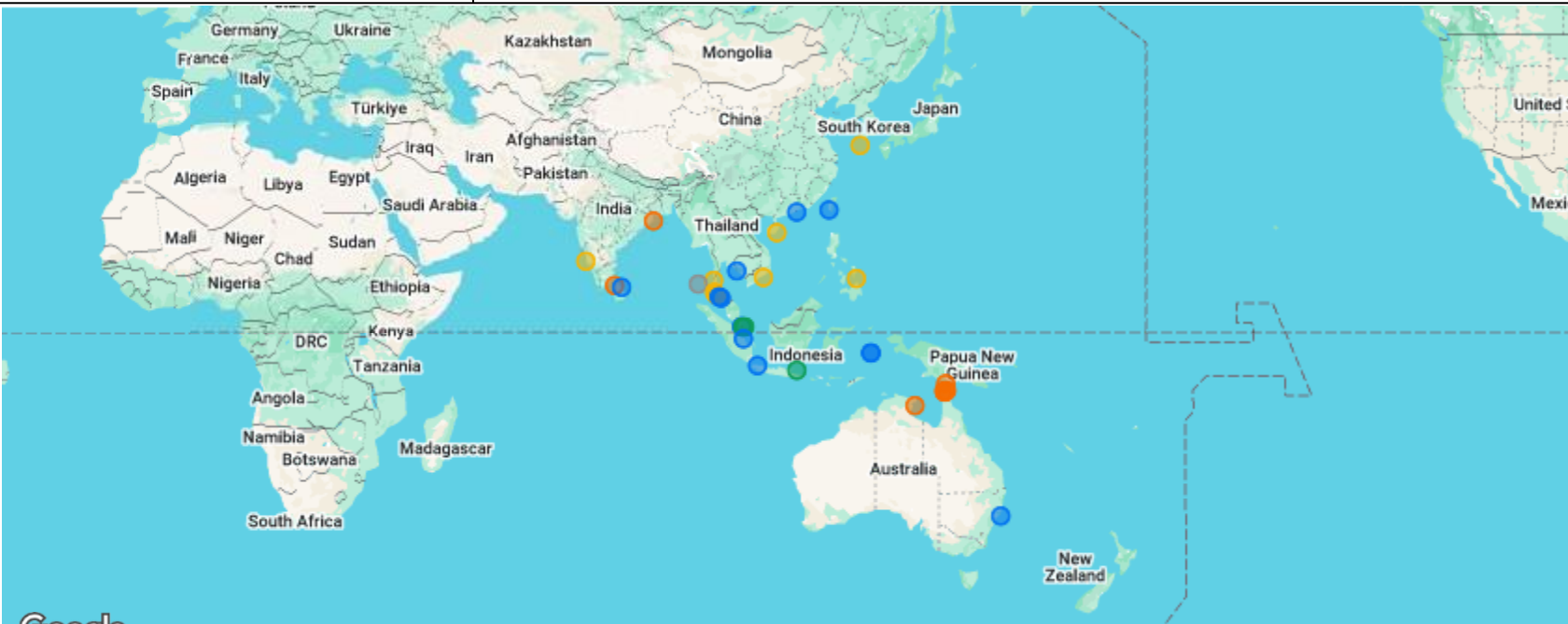

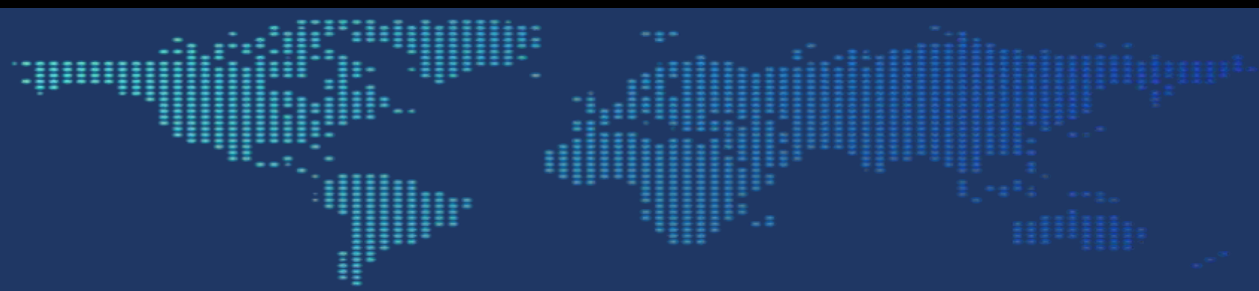

IFC Recommendations



1. All mariners to report any maritime security incidents timely to the nearest coastal state and inform the IFC at the earliest possible time.
2. All mariners are strongly recommended to be vigilant, in particularly when operating in IFC identified hotspots (**Westbound lane of Traffic Separation Scheme in Singapore Strait, Eastbound lane of Traffic Separation Scheme in Singapore Strait, Belawan and Dumai Anchorages in Indonesia, Manila Anchorage in the Philippines, and Chittagong Outer Anchorage in Bangladesh**).
3. All mariners are advised to adopt **Ship Protection Measures** recommended in the **Regional Guide to Counter Piracy and Armed Robbery Against Ships in Asia** (e.g., illuminating the accommodation block and poop deck, deploying sentries and increase frequency of security rounds).
4. All mariners to take note on the description of the perpetrators and to take photos of the perpetrators if possible. Where available, CCTV footage capturing the incident should be provided to **the coastal state authorities** for follow-on investigation.
5. All mariners are advised to participate in **IFC Voluntary Community Reporting (VCR)** as depicted in **MARSEC Chart O6112 and O6113**. In case of any doubt, incident at sea, suspicious approach or unusual observed activity at sea, please contact the IFC Duty Officer:

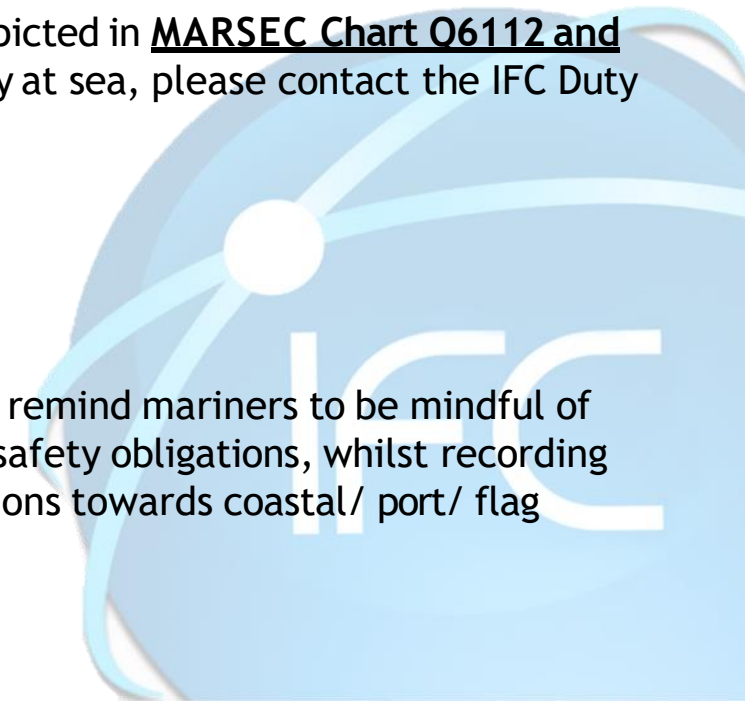
