Number of Incidents



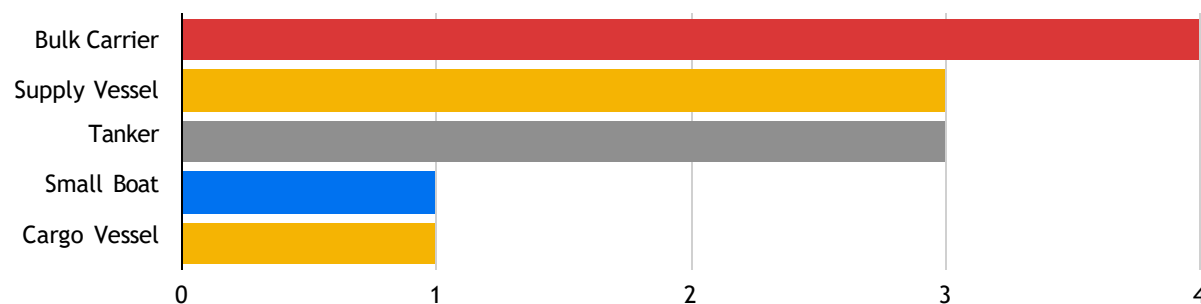

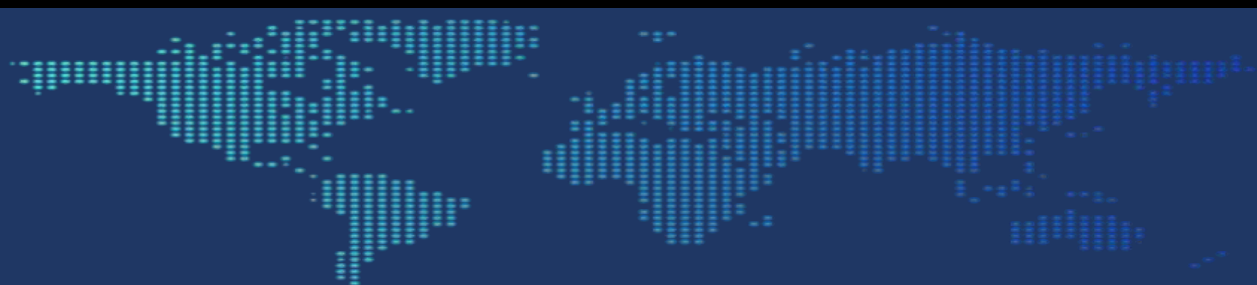

Executive Summary



Theft, Robbery and Piracy at Sea: 8 TRAPS incidents were reported in June 2026. Of note, 4 incidents occurred in the Singapore Strait, 3 incidents in Philippines and 1 incident in Indonesia.

Maritime Incidents: 62 MI incidents were reported in June 2026, which is similar over the same period in 2024 (88) and 2025 (62). The leading cause of incident is equipment failure (15).

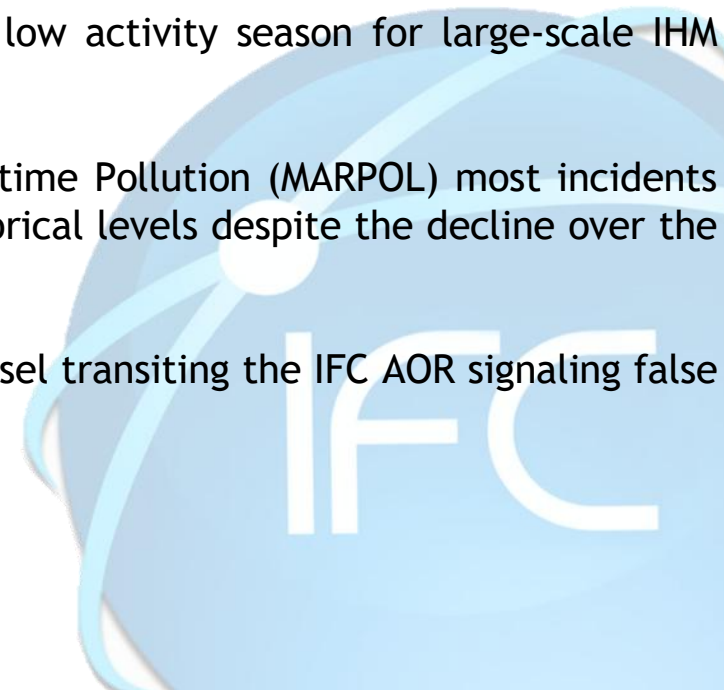
Illegal, Unreported, and Unregulated Fishing: 11 IUUF incidents were reported in June 2026, a noticeable decline overall and remained well below the levels recorded in June 2024, 2025. Local violations remained the main contributor, with Malaysia identified as the key hotspot, while poaching incidents increased slightly but were concentrated mainly in Australian waters.

Contraband Smuggling: 42 CS incidents were reported in June 2026, incident numbers for contraband smuggling has declined compared to previous month, but a noticeable increase in the quantities of contraband, particularly related to cocaine which involved larger vessels with larger quantities.

Irregular Human Migration: 6 IHM incidents were reported in June 2026, It is now the low activity season for large-scale IHM ventures from the Bay of Bengal to Malaysia or Indonesia.

Environmental Security: 10 ENVSEC incidents were reported in June 2026, involving Maritime Pollution (MARPOL) most incidents occurred in the SW of the South China Sea. Overall MARPOL incidents remained above historical levels despite the decline over the past two months.

Cyber Security: 40 CYBSEC incidents were reported in June 2026, all incidents involved vessel transiting the IFC AOR signaling false information over AIS.





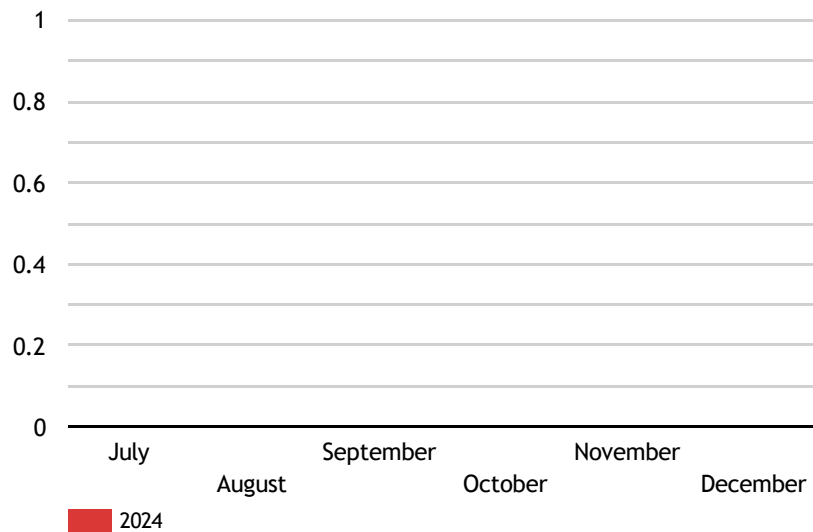

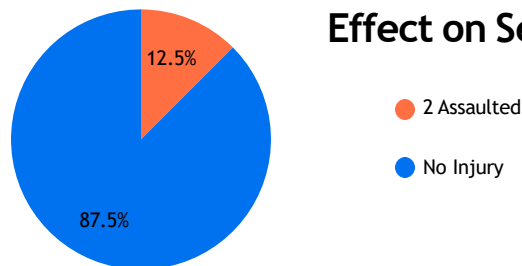

OBSERVATIONS

• A total of 8 TRAPS incidents (Boarding) were reported in Jun 2026, comprising four (4) incident in the Phillip Channel, Singapore Strait (SS), three (3) incidents in the waters off Manila, Philippines and one (1) incident off Pulau Batam, Indonesia. This represented a significant decrease compared to the same period in 2025 (22) and 2024 (11).

• All incidents occurred during the Period of Darkness (PoD), involving four (4) Bulk Carriers, three (3) Container Vessel and one (1) Tug & Barge.

Singapore Strait.

• Four incidents were reported involving Bulk Carriers while transiting the Phillip Channel, Singapore Strait. No injury to crew was reported. A crew member reportedly sighted the perpetrators armed with a knives and a gun-like objects. The perpetrators fled upon hearing the ship's alarm. Engine spare parts were reported stolen.

Philippines.

• Three incidents were reported involving Container Vessels anchored off Manila Waters, Philippines. No injury to crew was reported. Approximately four to six perpetrators, armed with knives and a gun, were reportedly sighted onboard. The perpetrators fled upon hearing the ship's alarm. Ship stores and other ship properties were reported stolen.

Indonesia.

• One incident was reported involving a Tug & Barge while transiting off Pulau Batam, Indonesia. No injury to crew was reported. Approximately three to six perpetrators were reportedly sighted onboard. The perpetrators fled upon hearing the ship's alarm. Four lashing wires, eight turnbuckles, one solar light, and ten shovels were reported stolen.

Comments.

• Based on crew accounts and incident reports, the modus operandi remained largely opportunistic. Target selection reflected the operating environment, with perpetrators primarily boarding slow-moving vessels underway in the Singapore Strait and off Pulau Batam, Indonesia, while anchored vessels remained the preferred targets off Manila Waters, Philippines. All incidents occurred during hours of darkness. Perpetrators avoided confrontation and withdrew upon detection or activation of the ship's alarm.

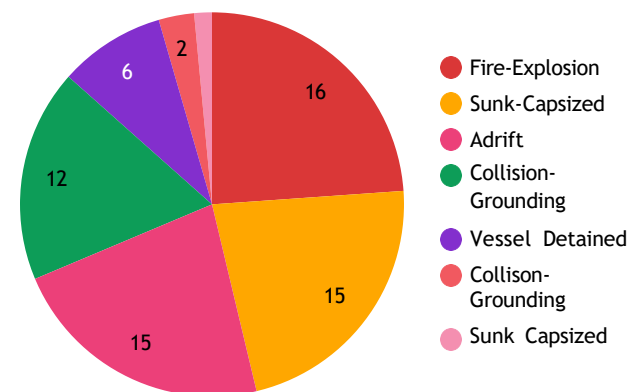
• With the Northeast Monsoon abating and weather conditions expected to become more favourable for fishing activities, the IFC assesses that opportunistic boarding incidents are likely to persist in the coming quarter, particularly in known areas of concern. All vessels are strongly advised to maintain heightened vigilance and implement recommended security measures when operating or transiting in known areas of concern.



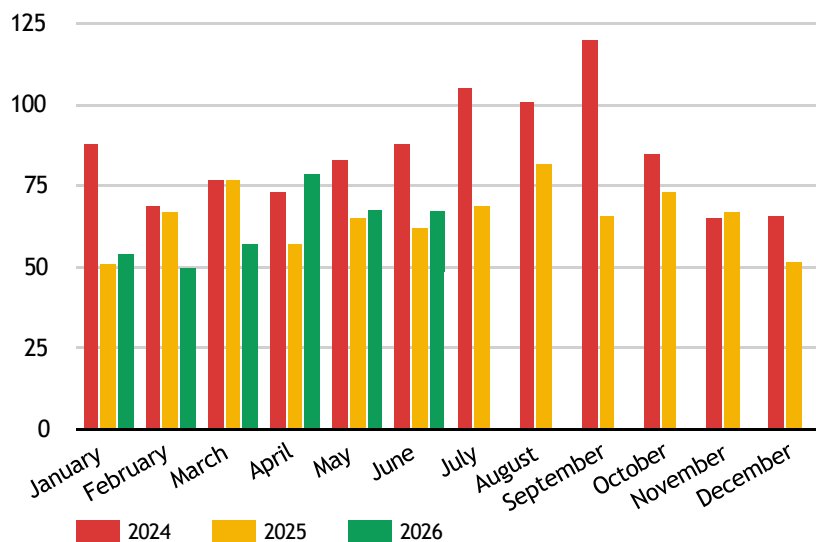
Maritime Incidents (MI)



Number of Vessels, by Type of Incident



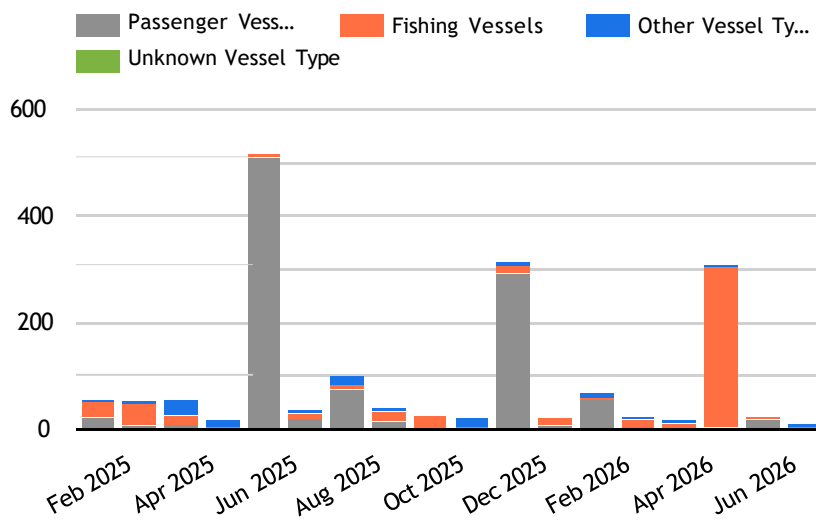

OBSERVATIONS

Statistics:

- A total of 62 Maritime incidents were reported for the month of June, which is similar number recorded in the same period for 2025 (62) but lower than in 2024 (88).
- The largest number of reported incidents was sunk-capsized (17), followed by Adrift (15), then Collision-Grounding (13).
- The cause of incident with the highest number is Equipment Failure (15), then Bad Weather (12), and Water Ingress (8).
- The types of vessels which have the highest number of incidents are Fishing Vessel (44), followed by Small Boat (13), then Passenger Vessel (9).
- In terms of location, the highest number of reported incidents occurred in the waters of ROK (19), followed by Philippines (10), then Malaysia (9).

- A total of (13) individuals were reported dead or missing this month, which is lower than last month (23). Overall, (51) SAR operations were conducted, resulting in the rescue of (448) individuals.

Comments:

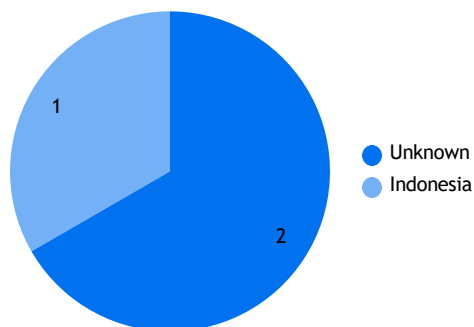
- The leading cause of incident for this month is equipment failure. However, due to the start of Typhoon Season and the expected impact of Super Typhoon Bavi in the AOI, incident caused by Bad Weather may increase in the following month.



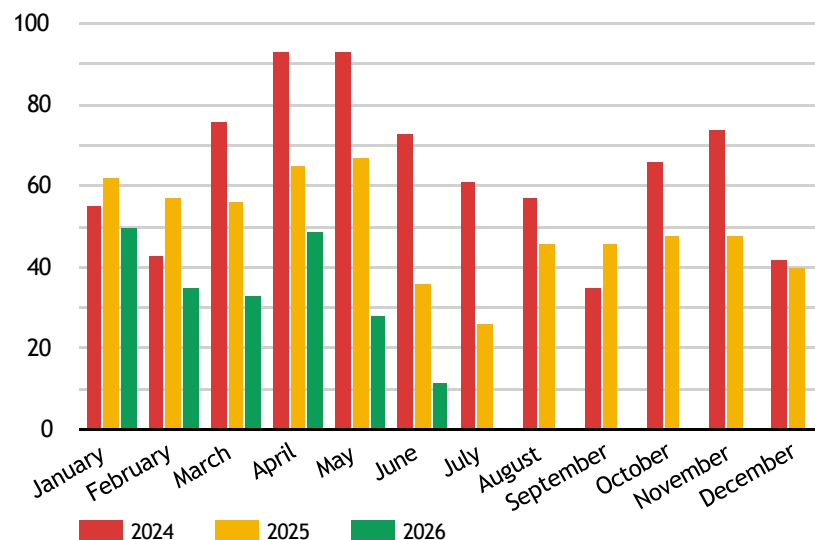

Number and Flag of Vessels, Poaching



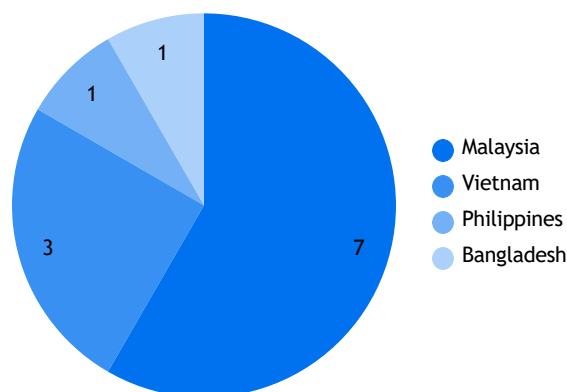

OBSERVATIONS

Statistics :

• A total of 11 IUUF incidents were recorded in June 2026, representing a significant decline compared to May 2026 (28 incidents), April 2026 (49 incidents), June 2025 (37 incidents), and June 2024 (73 incidents). The sustained downward trend in reported IUUF incidents indicates an overall improvement in the regional illegal fishing situation. Nevertheless, continued maritime surveillance, information sharing, and regional cooperation remain essential to deter illegal fishing activities and maintain this positive trend.

• Malaysia recorded the highest number of IUUF incidents in June 2026, with 7 reported cases, followed by Sabah, Vietnam, Bangladesh, and the Philippines, each recording 1 incident. The geographical distribution shows that most reported IUUF incidents occurred in Malaysian waters, while the remaining incidents were dispersed across other parts of the region.

• Local: A total of 8 local IUUF incidents were recorded in June 2026, representing a significant decline compared to May 2026 (17 incidents), April 2026 (42 incidents), June 2025 (24 incidents), and June 2024 (38 incidents). The figures indicate that local IUUF activity remained at a relatively low level during the reporting period.

• Malaysia accounted for the majority of local IUUF incidents with 5 cases, followed by Vietnam, Bangladesh, and the Philippines, each recording 1 case. The geographical distribution indicates that local IUUF incidents remained concentrated in Malaysian waters during the reporting period, while only isolated cases were reported elsewhere in the region.

• Poaching: A total of 3 poaching-related IUUF incidents were recorded in June 2026, representing a decline compared to May 2026 (11 incidents), April 2026 (7 incidents), June 2025 (13 incidents), and June 2024 (35 incidents). The figures indicate that poaching-related IUUF activity remained at a relatively low level during the reporting period.

• Malaysia accounted for the majority of poaching-related IUUF incidents with 2 cases, followed by Sabah with 1 case. The geographical distribution indicates that poaching-related IUUF incidents were primarily reported in Malaysian waters during the reporting period.

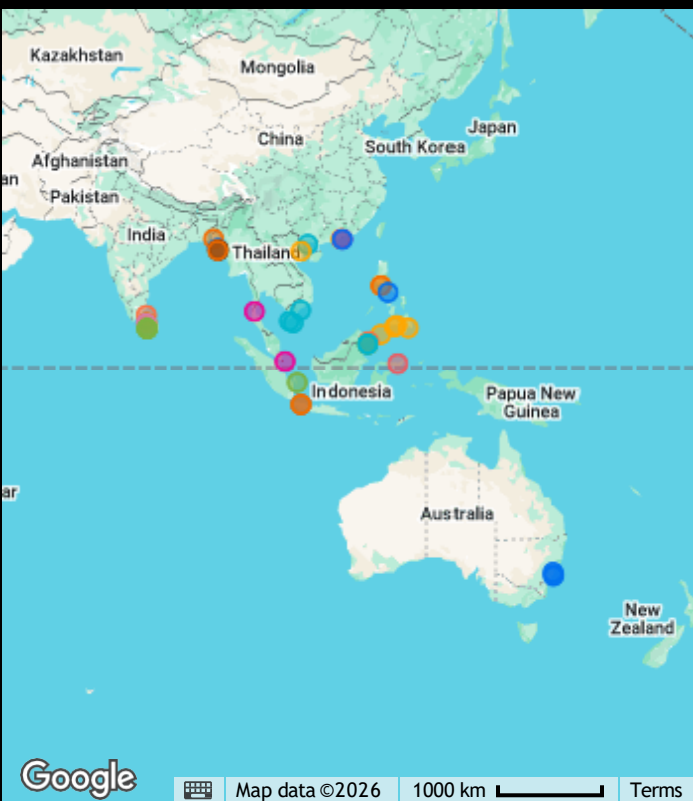

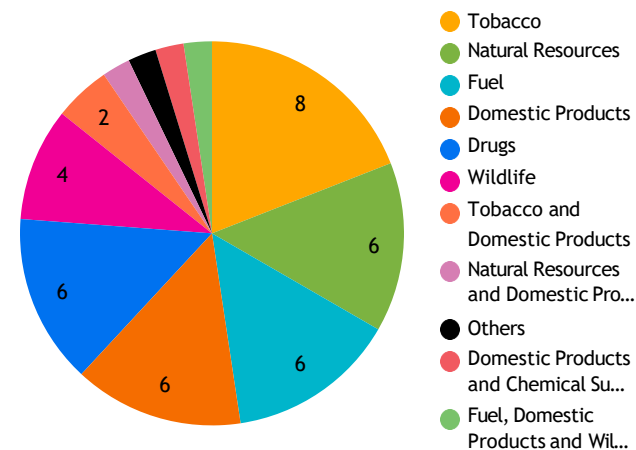
• IUUF incidents in June 2026 continued to decline and remained well below the levels recorded in June 2025 and June 2024, reflecting an overall reduction in reported illegal fishing activities across the region. Local violations remained the primary contributor, with Malaysia accounting for majority of reported incidents, while poaching-related incidents were limited and confined to Malaysia and Sabah. Although the overall trend remains positive, continued maritime surveillance, timely information sharing, and regional cooperation remain essential to sustain the decline and deter future illegal fishing activities.



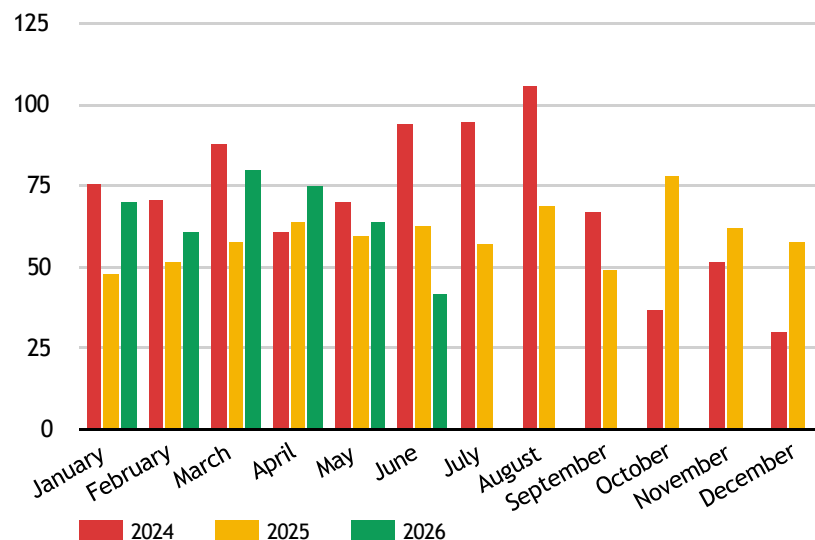
Contraband Smuggling (CS)



Types of Smuggled Goods



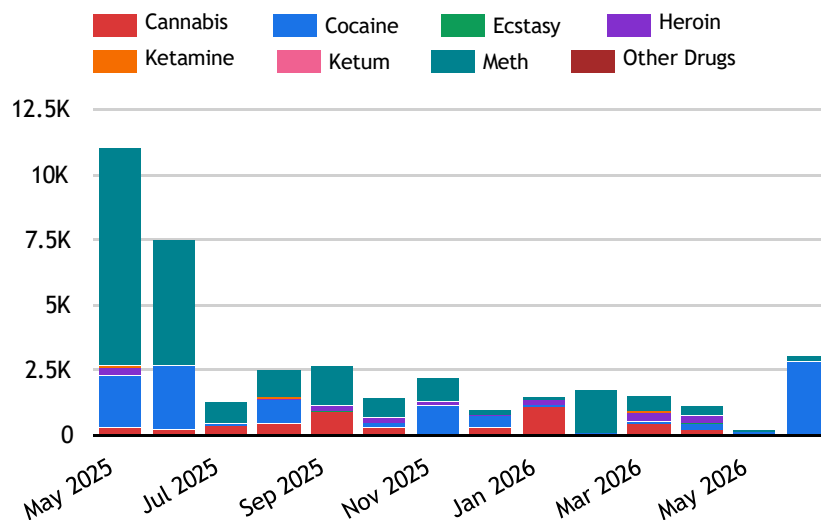

OBSERVATIONS

Statistics:

A total of 42 CS incidents were reported in June 2026, reflecting a decline from May 2026 (56). However, the quantity of contraband items has shifted to much bigger volume.

• **Domestic Products (x8):** Bangladesh (x5), Sri Lanka(x1), Sabah (x1), Indonesia(x1), Philippines (x1).

• **Fuel (x8):** Vietnam (x4), Philippines (x2), Sabah (x2).

• **Drugs (x7):** Australia (x3), Indonesia(x1), China(x1), Philippines (x1), Bangladesh (x1).

• **Tobacco (x9):** Philippines (x5), Sabah(x2), Viet Nam(x1), Hong Kong (x1).

• **Natural Resources (x6):** Sri Lanka (x4), Indonesia(x2).

• **Wildlife (x4):** Indonesia (x1), Thailand (x1), China(x1), Malaysia (x1).

• **Tobacco and Domestic Products (x3):** Sri Lanka (x1), Bangladesh(x1), Sabah (x1).

• **Natural Resources and Domestic Products (x1):** Sri Lanka (x1).

• **Domestic Products and Chemical Substances (x1):** Indonesia (x1).

• **Fuel, Domestic Products, and Wildlife (x1):** Sabah (x1).

• **Others (x1):** Bangladesh (x1)

Comments:

• Incident levels in June 2026 has dropped compared to the previous month, though the diversity of seized goods and geographical spread remain broad.

• **Domestic products** smuggling have dropped two times lower compared to previous month. This drop due to low demand of domestic products and strong presence of law effortment agencies .

• **Drug** smuggling remained a strategic shift toward larger quantity, with Australia is the main the destination with Cocaine 2,810kg, and Meth 200kg, followed by Indonesia with Meth 325kg.

• **Fuel** smuggling has dropped significantly with 6 cases reported this month from 11 cases reported in the previous month. The majority of incidents were reported in the waters of Vietnam and Malaysia.

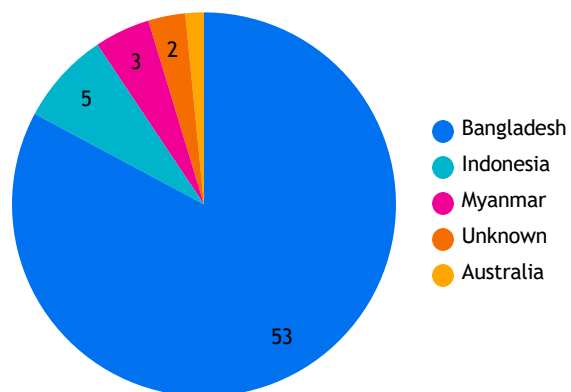
• **Tobacco** smuggling has decreased from 10 cases in the previous month to 8 cases reported this month. Most of the incidents were reported in the Philippines. Wildlife has also decreased slightly, while Indonesia remains the top destination.



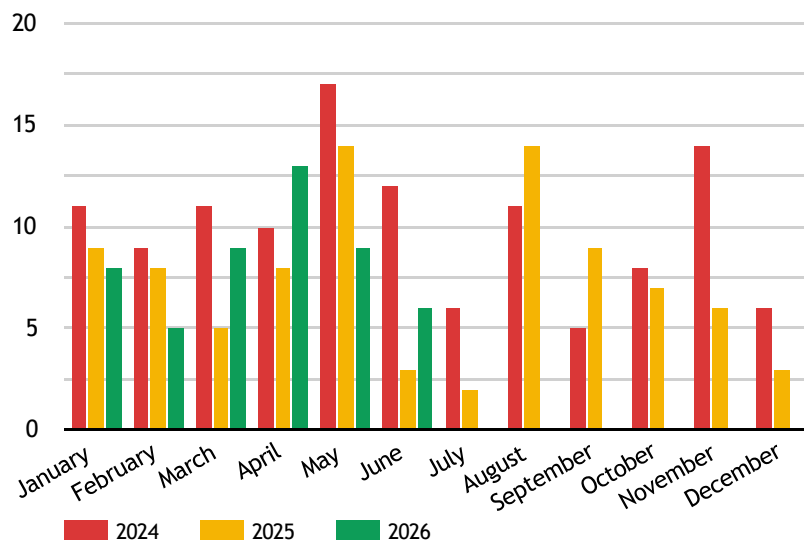
Irregular Human Migration (IHM)



Number and Nationality/Ethnicity of Migrants



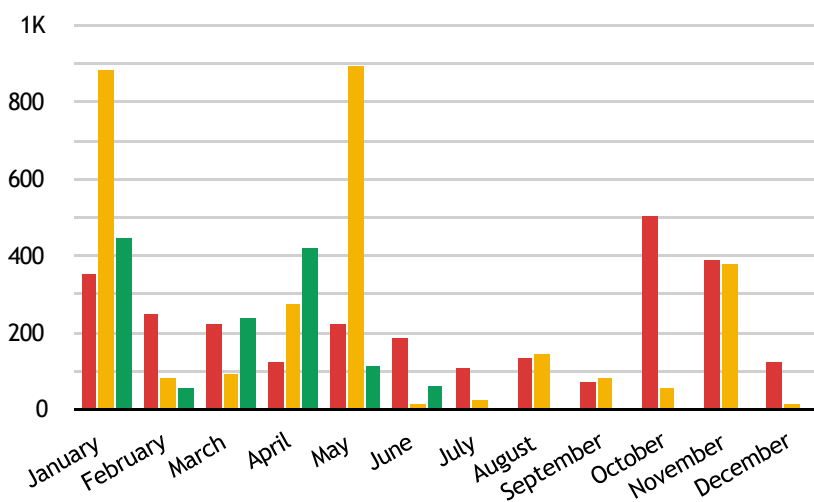

OBSERVATIONS

Statistics:

- There were a total of six IHM incidents reported in June 2026. There were four cases of Illegal Documentation, one case of Human Trafficking and one case classified as routine Irregular Human Migration.

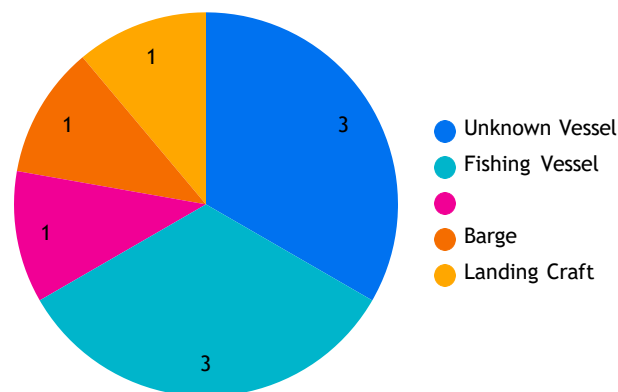
Comments:

- 1 incident, from early in the month, was a medium scale IHM incident involving approximately 50 Bangladeshi and Rohingya migrants being trafficked to Malaysia. This is unusually late in the year for a east-Indian Ocean transit, and is also unusual in that it was specifically reported as Human trafficking, with evidence that migrants had had passports confiscated and that there had been false promises of employment and other hallmarks of Human Trafficking. It is possible that this was a specific criminal venture aimed at exploiting vulnerable migrants rather than the more routine mass-migrant boat normally seen transiting from Bangladesh to Malaysia.

- Four illegal documentation incidents involved foreign workers working illegally on Malaysian fishing vessels

- The remaining IHM incident was an Australian man attempting to illegally depart Australia and enter an unknown country in order to evade local law enforcement.

- It is now the low activity season for large-scale IHM ventures from the Bay of Bengal to Malaysia or Indonesia. Travel in the Bay of Bengal during the next few months is dangerous, with a high risk of capsizing due to bad weather. It is likely that large scale, crowded IHM vessels will resume activity in October or November after the Indian Ocean monsoon season has passed.



OBSERVATIONS

• Most ENVSEC incidents occurred in the SW of the South China Sea (5), followed by the Republic of Korea (ROK) (3), while the Philippines and Indonesia recorded 1 incident each. The geographical distribution indicates that environmental security incidents remained concentrated in the SW of the South China Sea, with fewer isolated incidents reported elsewhere in the region.

Maritime Pollution (MARPOL) : 10 maritime pollution incidents were recorded in June 2026, representing a slight decrease from May 2026 (11 incidents) and April 2026 (14 incidents). Compared with the same period in previous years, the figure remained higher than June 2025 (5 incidents) and June 2024 (4 incidents). Most incidents occurred in the SW of the South China Sea (5), followed by the Republic of Korea (ROK) (3), while the Philippines and Indonesia recorded 1 incident each. Overall, maritime pollution incidents remained above historical levels despite the continued decline over the past two months.

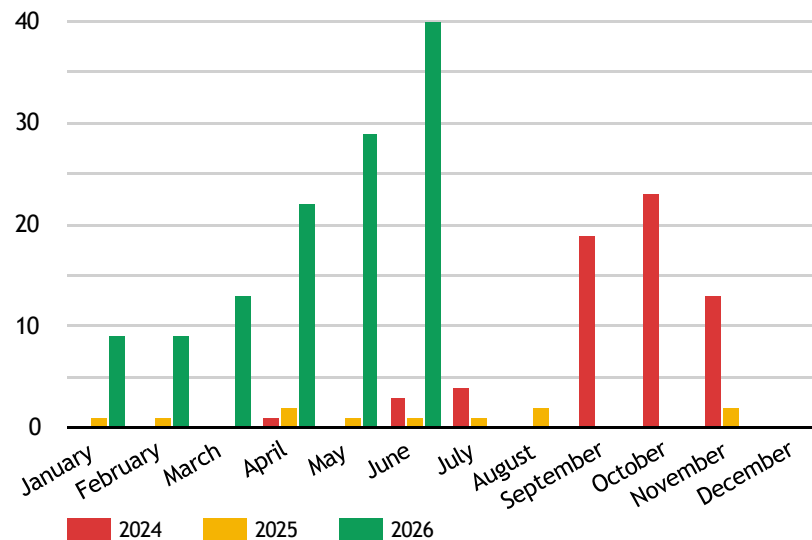
- ENVSEC incidents in June 2026 continued to decline from the previous two months but remained above the levels recorded in June 2025 and June 2024, with all reported incidents attributed to maritime pollution. Incidents were primarily concentrated in the SW of the South China Sea, followed by the Republic of Korea (ROK), reflecting the continued occurrence of pollution events in busy maritime areas. Although no major environmental disaster was reported, sustained monitoring, timely reporting, and regional cooperation remain essential to mitigate potential impacts on the marine environment.

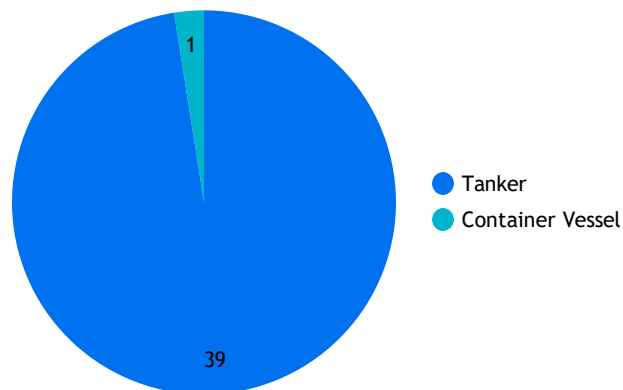

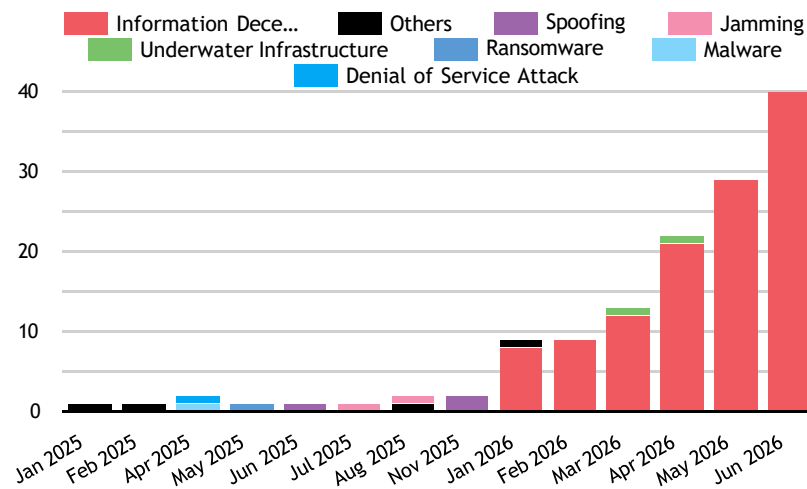

OBSERVATIONS

Statistics:

- There were 40 CYBSEC incident reported in June 2026.

Comments:

• All of the incidents involved a vessel transiting the IFC AOR signalling false information over AIS. This information may have included a false name, flag or vessel type, intended to deceive observers as to the nature and purpose of the vessel. IFC reporting indicates that this problem is endemic through the region, as IFC processes on reporting this activity become more robust we will likely see further month-on-month increases.

- There were no reports of damage to underwater telecommunications cables and no reports of an incident in maritime cyberspace.

Note:

• As of Jan 2026, IFC has updated how we report on CYBSEC incidents, moving to a target-centric reporting focus rather than method-centric. This will allow IFC to better categorise and analyse CYBSEC incidents in the region and more easily understand and report threats. IFC has also commenced reporting on dark or grey vessels conducting information deception (via AIS) this year, significantly increasing reporting numbers compared to 2025.

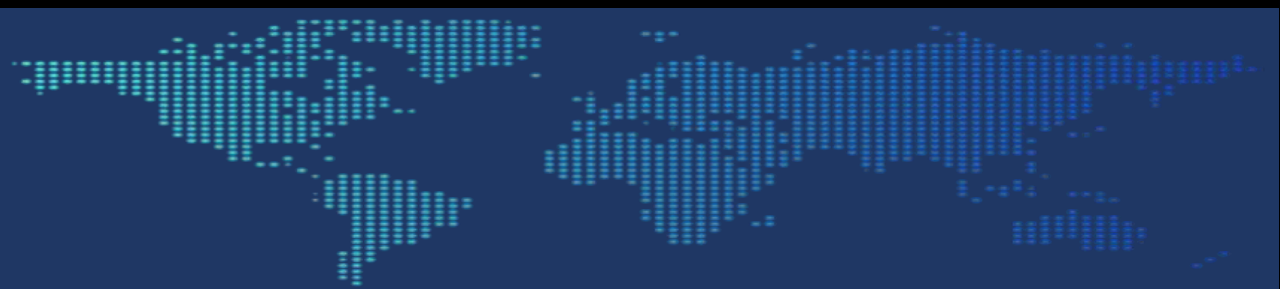

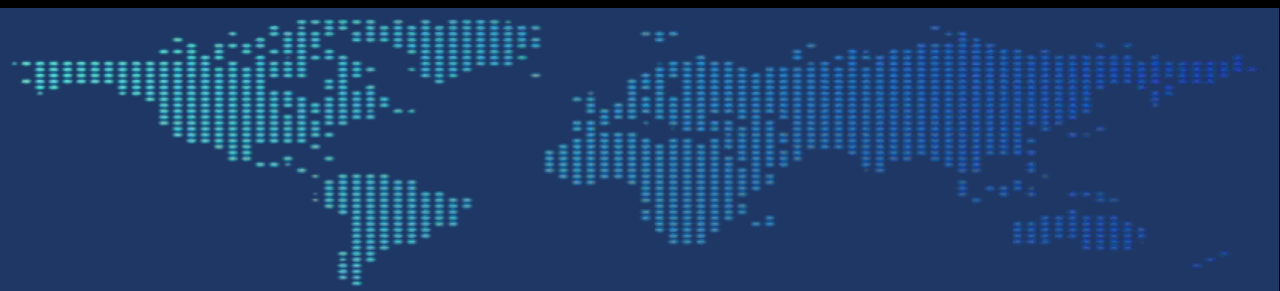

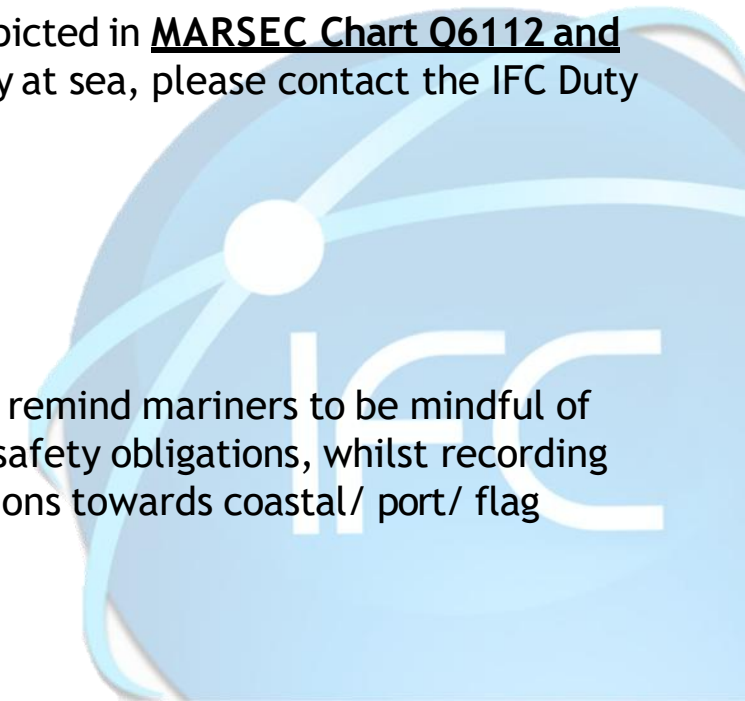


IFC Recommendations



1. All mariners to report any maritime security incidents timely to the nearest coastal state and inform the IFC at the earliest possible time.
2. All mariners are strongly recommended to be vigilant, in particularly when operating in IFC identified hotspots (**Westbound lane of Traffic Separation Scheme in Singapore Strait, Eastbound lane of Traffic Separation Scheme in Singapore Strait, Belawan and Dumai Anchorages in Indonesia, Manila Anchorage in the Philippines, and Chittagong Outer Anchorage in Bangladesh**).
3. All mariners are advised to adopt **Ship Protection Measures** recommended in the **Regional Guide to Counter Piracy and Armed Robbery Against Ships in Asia** (e.g., illuminating the accommodation block and poop deck, deploying sentries and increase frequency of security rounds).
4. All mariners to take note on the description of the perpetrators and to take photos of the perpetrators if possible. Where available, CCTV footage capturing the incident should be provided to **the coastal state authorities** for follow-on investigation.
5. All mariners are advised to participate in **IFC Voluntary Community Reporting (VCR)** as depicted in **MARSEC Chart O6112 and O6113**. In case of any doubt, incident at sea, suspicious approach or unusual observed activity at sea, please contact the IFC Duty Officer:
