### SECTION A: THEFT, ROBBERY AND PIRACY AT SEA (TRAPS)

#### Incidents:

08 Apr - Boarding/ Sea Theft/ Container Ship, Singapore-Flagged/ No Injury/ Anchored/ Off Chittagong, Bangladesh/ DB090424

Whilst at anchor in position on 8 Apr at 01:58 (UTC+6), duty watchman on deck noticed two persons on the main deck forward Port Side of a container ship. The persons started chasing the watchman who ran inside accommodation block and alerted the bridge. Alarm was raised and crew mustered inside accommodation. Notifications were made to company and local coast guard. At 02:20 (UTC+6), a boat was noticed going away from the ship. Once coast guard came for patrols, own crew made a search on deck and discovered that these persons stole a considerable amount of stores and paint from paint store and bosun store forward.

06 Apr - Boarding/ Sea Theft/ Tug and Barge, Malaysia-Flagged/ No Injury/ Underway/ Westbound Lane of TSS, Singapore Strait/ DB080424

- 1. POCC reported that an unauthorised boarding involving a Malaysia-flagged tug & barge as the vessel transited along the Westbound lane of TSS, Singapore Strait (1°18'35.4"N 104°15'46.2"E) on 6 Apr 24 at 1645 (UTC +8). Crew reportedly sighted 3 unarmed perpetrators boarded the barge.
- 2. Ship master reported that all crew are safe and accounted for, and nothing was yet reported stolen. The vessel does not require any assistance and will continue her voyage to NPOC, Singapore.

AMSA is currently coordinating the response to a search and rescue operation at Cartier Island following a report received that an aircraft had sighted a semi-submerged fishing vessel on the reef in the vicinity of Cartier Island, with six people on land waving at the aircraft. AMSA tasked ADV Cape Woolamai, which recovered all six people in good health and returned them to Darwin, where arrangements were being made for their repatriation.

### IFC RECOMMENDATIONS

### The IFC advises:

- 1. All mariners report any maritime security incidents timely to the nearest coastal state and inform the IFC at the earliest possible time.
- 2. All mariners are strongly recommended to be vigilant, in particularly when operating in IFC identified hotspots (Sulu-Celebes seas, Eastbound Lane of Traffic Separation Scheme in Singapore Strait, Jakarta Port in Indonesia and South Harbor Anchorage in Philippines).
- 3. All mariners are advised to adopt Ship Protection Measures recommended in the Regional Guide to Counter Piracy and Armed Robbery Against Ships in Asia (e.g., illuminating the accommodation block and poop deck, deploying sentries and increase frequency of security rounds).
- 4. All mariners to take note of the description of the perpetrators and to take photos of the perpetrators if possible. Where available, CCTV footage capturing the incident should be provided to the coastal state authorities for follow-on investigation.
- 5. All mariners are advised to participate in IFC Voluntary Community Reporting (VCR) as depicted in MARSEC Chart Q6112 and Q6113. In case of any doubt, incident at sea, suspicious approach or unusual observed activity at sea, please contact the IFC Duty Officer:

Ships should apply the appropriate security measures (such as Tugs and Barge Guide, Guide for Tankers Operating in Asia, or Regional Guide to Counter Piracy and Armed Robbery Against Ships in Asia). Ship masters should also be aware and refer to the Maritime Security Charts Q6112 and Q6113, both published by the UK Hydrographic Office.
