### SECTION A: THEFT, ROBBERY AND PIRACY AT SEA (TRAPS)

### Incidents:

29 Mar - Boarding/ Sea Theft/ Cargo Ship, Marshall Islands-Flagged/ No Injury/ Anchored/ Chattogram Anchorage, Bangladesh/ DB030424

Ship and security personnel onboard an anchored ship noticed three people in a boat attempting to gain access to the ship using a rope and hook. The alarm was raised and crew mustered, resulting in the people aborting and moving away.

31 Mar - Boarding/ Sea Theft/ Tug and Barge, Indonesia-Flagged/ No Injury/ Underway/ Phillip Channel, Singapore Strait/ DB010424

The Indonesian Navy (TNI AL), in this case the First Fleet Quick Response (F1QR) of the Tanjung Balai Karimun Navy Base (Lanal), succeeded in thwarting and arresting four perpetrators of the crime of theft at sea around the waters of Tanjung Balai Karimun on 31 Mar.

The incident started with the information that there was a plan to return home a group of illegal Indonesian Migrant Workers (TKI) from Malaysia who passed through Karimun Anak waters, which the F1QR team managed to detect. After carrying out surveillance for several hours, the ship suspected of being used to commit theft at sea was detected and was immediately inspected.

From the results of the examination, cable trosses, dampers, riding buoys, as well as tools such as hacksaws, machetes and hammer was found, and the perpetrator admitted carried out theft of on a tug and barge.

The four perpetrators and the evidence were taken to Lanal TBK Pier to carry out further investigations and legal proceedings.

30 Mar - Boarding/ Sea Theft/ Bulk Carrier, Liberia-Flagged/ No Injury/ Underway/ Phillip Channel, Singapore Strait/ DB010424

- 1. POCC reported that an unauthorised boarding involving a Liberia-flagged bulk carrier as the vessel transited along the Phillip Channel, Singapore Strait (01 03.43N 103 39.22E) on 30 Mar 24 at 0014 (UTC +8). Crew reportedly sighted 3 perpetrators armed with knives inside engine room and have since fled upon raising alarm.
- 2. Ship master reported that all crew are safe and accounted for, and checks is still ongoing. The vessel does not require any assistance and will continue her voyage to NPOC, Singapore.

Indonesia ILO highlighted that one of their assets was in the vicinity and responded to the incident

- 29 Mar Boarding/ Sea Theft/ Bulk Carrier, Panama-Flagged/ No Injury/ Anchored/ Kutubdia Anchorage, Bangladesh/ DB010424
- 1. On 29 Mar, at around 08:00 (UTC+6), information was received from the BCG Ops Room regarding a petty theft incident that occurred on board a bulk carrier on 28 Mar. The ship was anchored at Kutubdia Anchorage.
- 2. Upon receiving the information, BCGS APURBO BANGLA communicated with the ship through VHF and proceeded towards the vessel. The BCGS APURBO BANGLA boarding team boarded the vessel via Metal Shark 4.
- 3. The captain of the bulk carrier confirmed that all crews are safe.
- 4. The incident was not reported to BCG or CPA. BCG came to know about the matter via an IMB email. During the investigation, it was found that there was no port authorised watchman. However, after the incident, the shipping agent sent a local watchman on 28 Mar. The ship couldn't provide any pictures or CCTV footage of the incident or thieves.
- 5. A NOC has been obtained from the captain.

- 1. All mariners report any maritime security incidents timely to the nearest coastal state and inform the IFC at the earliest possible time.
- 2. All mariners are strongly recommended to be vigilant, in particularly when operating in IFC identified hotspots (Sulu-Celebes seas, Eastbound Lane of Traffic Separation Scheme in Singapore Strait, Jakarta Port in Indonesia and South Harbor Anchorage in Philippines).
- 3. All mariners are advised to adopt Ship Protection Measures recommended in the Regional Guide to Counter Piracy and Armed Robbery Against Ships in Asia (e.g., illuminating the accommodation block and poop deck, deploying sentries and increase frequency of security rounds).
- 4. All mariners to take note of the description of the perpetrators and to take photos of the perpetrators if possible. Where available, CCTV footage capturing the incident should be provided to the coastal state authorities for follow-on investigation.
- 5. All mariners are advised to participate in IFC Voluntary Community Reporting (VCR) as depicted in MARSEC Chart Q6112 and Q6113. In case of any doubt, incident at sea, suspicious approach or unusual observed activity at sea, please contact the IFC Duty Officer:
