SECTION A: THEFT, ROBBERY AND PIRACY AT SEA (TRAPS)

07 Jul - Boarding/ Sea Theft/ Bulk Carrier, Marshall Islands-Flagged/ No Injury/ Underway/ Phillip Channel, Singapore Strait/ DB070725

1. POCC reported an unauthorised boarding involving a Marshall Islands-flagged bulk carrier, as vessel transited along Phillip Channel, Singapore Strait (1°03'47.4"N 103°38'00.0"E) on 7 Jul at 03:30 (UTC +8). The crew reportedly sighted three unarmed perpetrators in the engine room.

2. The shipmaster reported that all crew are safe and accounted for, and nothing was stolen. The vessel does not require any assistance and will continue her voyage to NPOC, Singapore.

06 Jul - Attempted Boarding/ Sea Theft/ Tanker, Kuwait-Flagged/ No Injury/ Underway/ Phillip Channel, Singapore Strait/ DB070725

1. POCC reported an attempted boarding involving a Kuwait-flagged tanker, as vessel transited along Phillip Channel, Singapore Strait (1°03'46.2"N 103°37'19.8"E) on 6 Jul at 22:12 (UTC +8). The crew reportedly sighted three perpetrators attempted to board the vessel.

2. The shipmaster reported that all crew are safe and accounted for. The vessel does not require any assistance and will continue her voyage to NPOC, Qingdao, China.

06 Jul - Boarding/ Sea Theft/ Bulk Carrier, Marshall Islands-Flagged/ No Injury/ Underway/
Phillip Channel, Singapore Strait/ DB070725

1. POCC reported that an unauthorised boarding involving a Marshall Islands-flagged bulk carrier, as vessel transited along the Phillip Channel, Singapore Strait (1° 02'48.6 N 103° 39'31.8 E) on 6 Jul, at 00:35 (UTC +8).

2. Crew reportedly sighted five perpetrators armed with knives in the engine room. The ship crew sounded the alarm and mustered the crew for safety. All crew were accounted for with no injuries, and crew were unable to determine if items were stolen yet. The vessel will continue her voyage to NPOC, Singapore.

07 Jul - Boarding/ Sea Theft/ Container Ship, France-Flagged/ No Injury/ Underway/
Phillip Channel, Singapore Strait/ DB080725

1. IFC received information about an unauthorised boarding involving a France-flagged container ship, on 7 Jul, at 00:15 (UTC +8). Based on AIS playback, the estimated incident position was in Phillip Channel (1°03'02.0"N 103°39'32.0"E).

2. The crew discovered that the vessel was boarded when a broken lock was found during security rounds while the vessel was in anchorage (SG). Reviewing the footage, six perpetrators armed with knives and one with a gun-like object boarded the vessel via the chock liner at the poop deck. The perpetrators fled after the alarm at the engine room went off.

3. The shipmaster reported that all crew are safe and accounted for, and nothing was stolen.

06 Jul - Boarding/ Sea Theft/ Container Ship, Singapore-Flagged/ No Injury/ Phillip Channel, Singapore Strait/ DB080725

1. POCC reported an unauthorised boarding involving a Singapore-flagged container ship as vessel transited along Phillip Channel, Singapore Strait (01° 02.71 N 103° 39.32 E) on 6 Jul, at 20:30 (UTC +8). Crew reportedly sighted three unarmed perpetrators disembarking the ship when the ship sounded the alarm and mustered the crew.

2. The shipmaster reported that all crew are safe and accounted for, and nothing was stolen. The vessel does not require any assistance and will continue her voyage to NPOC, Singapore.

09 Jul - Boarding/ Sea Theft/ Tanker, Liberia-Flagged/ No Injury/ Anchored/ Chattogram Anchorage, Bangladesh/ DB110725

On 9 Jul at 20:20 (UTC +6), an incident of sea theft was reported on board a Liberia-flagged tanker, at Chattogram Anchorage, Bangladesh. Reportedly, seven perpetrators boarded the vessel. Perpetrators escaped after the ship's crew raised the alarm, and nothing was stolen. All crew were reported safe.

09 Jul - Boarding/ Sea Theft/ Tanker, Denmark-Flagged/ No Injury/ Underway/ Phillip Channel, Singapore Strait/ DB110725

1. POCC reported an unauthorised boarding involving a Denmark-flagged tanker, as vessel transited along the Phillip Channel, Singapore Strait (1°03.60 N 103°41.32 E) on 9 Jul, at 02:20 (UTC +8).

2. The ship's crew reportedly sighted a blue wooden boat alongside her port quarter and raised the general alarm. Six perpetrators were seen disembarking and leaving on the blue wooden boat. No perpetrators were found onboard, and some engine spares were reportedly stolen.

3. All crew were accounted for with no injuries. The vessel is currently on her voyage to NPOC, China.

08 Jul - Boarding/ Sea Theft/ Tanker, Singapore-Flagged/ No Injury/ Underway/ Eastbound Lane of TSS, Singapore Strait/ DB110725

1. POCC reported an unauthorised boarding involving a Singapore-flagged tanker, as vessel transited along the Eastbound Lane of TSS, Singapore Strait (1° 10 57.6 N 103° 51 14.4 E) on 8 Jul, between 02:00 and 04:00 (UTC +8).

2. The ship crew reportedly discovered aft door behind the galley was ajar while passing through, and found out that some engine spares were missing. Based on the ship's internal investigation, the perpetrators may have boarded the vessel between 02:00 to 04:00 (UTC +8) via the skylight hatch located at the poop deck portside provision hatch and exited through the aft door.

3. The ship reported that all crew were accounted for, with no injuries reported. The vessel is currently on her voyage to NPOC, Vietnam.

2. Ship master reported that all crew are safe and accounted for and was unable to determine if items were stolen yet. The vessel does not require any assistance and will continue her voyage to NPOC, Singapore.

On 8 May, while a tugboat was towing a barge, three perpetrators boarded the barge and stole items such as manhole covers, ropes, solar lights and turnbuckles and subsequently escaped.

IFC RECOMMENDATIONS

The IFC advises:

1. All mariners report any maritime security incidents timely to the nearest coastal state and inform the IFC at the earliest possible time.
2. All mariners are strongly recommended to be vigilant, in particularly when operating in IFC identified hotspots (Sulu-Celebes seas, Eastbound Lane of Traffic Separation Scheme in Singapore Strait, Jakarta Port in Indonesia and South Harbor Anchorage in Philippines).
3. All mariners are advised to adopt Ship Protection Measures recommended in the Regional Guide to Counter Piracy and Armed Robbery Against Ships in Asia (e.g., illuminating the accommodation block and poop deck, deploying sentries and increase frequency of security rounds).
4. All mariners to take note of the description of the perpetrators and to take photos of the perpetrators if possible. Where available, CCTV footage capturing the incident should be provided to the coastal state authorities for follow-on investigation.
5. All mariners are advised to participate in IFC Voluntary Community Reporting (VCR) as depicted in MARSEC Chart Q6112 and Q6113. In case of any doubt, incident at sea, suspicious approach or unusual observed activity at sea, please contact the IFC Duty Officer:
