13 Jun - Boarding/ Sea Theft/ Bulk Carrier, Hong-Kong Flagged/ No Injury/ Underway/ Phillip Channel, Singapore Strait/ DB160625

It was updated that a breathing apparatus and charging air compressor were stolen.

23 Jun - Boarding/ Sea Theft/ Tanker, Singapore-Flagged/ No Injury/ Underway/ Phillip Channel, Singapore Strait/ DB230625

1. POCC reported an unauthorised boarding involving Singapore-flagged tanker, as vessel transited along Phillip Channel, Singapore Strait (1°03'36.0"N 103°41'00.0"E) on 23 Jun 2025, at 03:23 (UTC +8). Crew reportedly sighted four perpetrators armed with knives in the engine room.

2. Ship master reported that all crew are safe and accounted for, and three (20L) drums of paint were missing. The vessel does not require any assistance and will continue her voyage to NPOC, Singapore.

21 Jun - Boarding/ Sea Theft/ Container Ship, Cyprus-Flagged/ No Injury/ Anchored/ Chattogram Anchorage, Bangladesh/ DB260625

On 21 Jun, an incident of sea robbery was reported onboard the Cyprus-flagged container ship at Chattogram anchorage, Bangladesh.

Reportedly, eight perpetrators armed with knives boarded the ship while at anchor. Perpetrators escaped with ship's items. All crew members are safe.

27 Jun - Boarding/ Sea Theft/ Tanker, Cameroon-Flagged/ No Injury/ Underway/ Phillip Channel, Singapore Strait/ DB270625

1. POCC reported that an unauthorised boarding involving Cameroon-flagged tanker, as vessel transited along the Phillip Channel, Singapore Strait (1° 05'42 N 103° 43'51 E) on 27 Jun 2025, at 00:32 (UTC +8).

2. Crew reportedly sighted four perpetrators in the engine room with one holding a gun-like object. Ship alarm was sounded and the perpetrators fled. Ship master reported that all crew are safe and accounted for and engine parts were stolen. Vessel will continue her voyage to NPOC, China.

19 Jun - Boarding/ Sea Theft/ Supply Vessel, Antigua & Barbuda-Flagged/ No Injury/ Anchored/ Off Kakinada, India/ DB250625

On 19 Jun, an incident of illegal boarding was reported on board an Antigua & Barbuda-flagged supply vessel off Kakinada, India. Reportedly, five perpetrators in a fishing vessel boarded the supply vessel while anchored and were sighted by the crew. All five perpetrators were apprehended by Indian authorities and all crew members were reported safe.

13 Jun - Boarding/ Sea Theft/ Bulk Carrier, Panama-Flagged/ No Injury/ Underway/ Straits of Malacca and Singapore/ DB270625

Five robbers armed with knives boarded a ship underway, stole ship's properties and escaped. The theft was noticed during routine inspection and after reviewing CCTV footage.

04 May - Boarding/ Sea Theft/ Container Ship, Portugal-Flagged/ No Injury/ Anchored/ Jakarta Anchorage, Indonesia/ DB270625

While at anchor, three to four perpetrators boarded the ship at the aft mooring station when the crew was occupied at the forecastle with weighing anchor for departure from anchorage to the port.

As all entry doors to restricted areas were locked and secured, the perpetrators stole one heaving line and cut the cables of door sensors (to passageways and the steering gear room) before they escaped. The crew was not injured.

ID ILO updated the report received from Jakarta:

The Container Ship was in Jakarta Bay and dropped anchor on May 3, 2025. There is no clear proof that a sea theft happened, because no report was sent to the Indonesian Authorities by the ship's agent. Besides, the vessel was scheduled to berth directly at Tanjung Perak Port, Surabaya, and did not have the required PKKA permit as a foreign vessel to conduct any activities at Tanjung Priok Port (JICT), Jakarta, at that time.

IFC RECOMMENDATIONS

The IFC advises:

1. All mariners report any maritime security incidents timely to the nearest coastal state and inform the IFC at the earliest possible time.
2. All mariners are strongly recommended to be vigilant, in particularly when operating in IFC identified hotspots (Sulu-Celebes seas, Eastbound Lane of Traffic Separation Scheme in Singapore Strait, Jakarta Port in Indonesia and South Harbor Anchorage in Philippines).
3. All mariners are advised to adopt Ship Protection Measures recommended in the Regional Guide to Counter Piracy and Armed Robbery Against Ships in Asia (e.g., illuminating the accommodation block and poop deck, deploying sentries and increase frequency of security rounds).
4. All mariners to take note of the description of the perpetrators and to take photos of the perpetrators if possible. Where available, CCTV footage capturing the incident should be provided to the coastal state authorities for follow-on investigation.
5. All mariners are advised to participate in IFC Voluntary Community Reporting (VCR) as depicted in MARSEC Chart Q6112 and Q6113. In case of any doubt, incident at sea, suspicious approach or unusual observed activity at sea, please contact the IFC Duty Officer:
